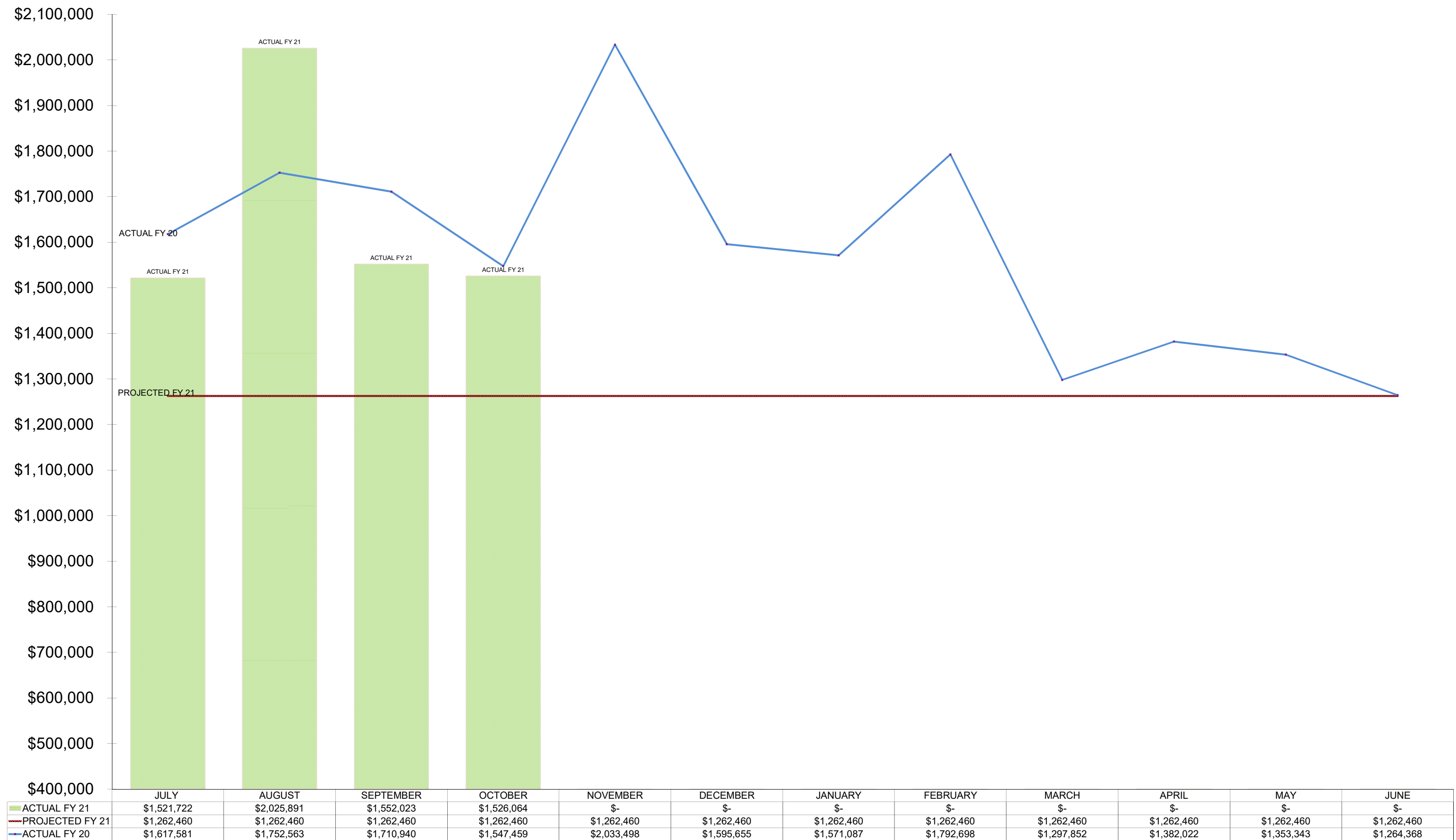

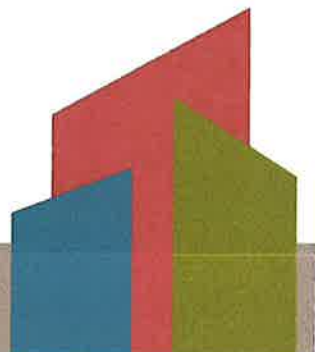

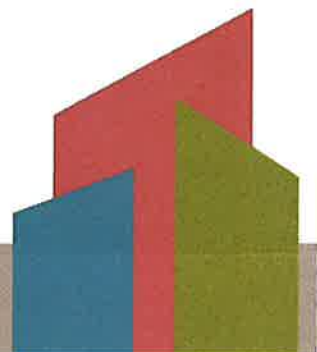

Natrona County has (unfortunately) been a leader in the state's unemployment claims, since March 2020. Prior to COVID-19, back in July 2019, Natrona County had an unemployment rate of 3.7%; as of July 2020 we were sitting at 10.2%, estimates for August are 9.4%. There are currently no operational wells (oil or gas) in the state. State employees have been asked to take a 10% budget cut, and just last month a second round of cuts began. City of Casper employees are participating in a furlough program to avoid layoffs. There is not a business sector that hasn't been affected by the pandemic and the economic crisis.

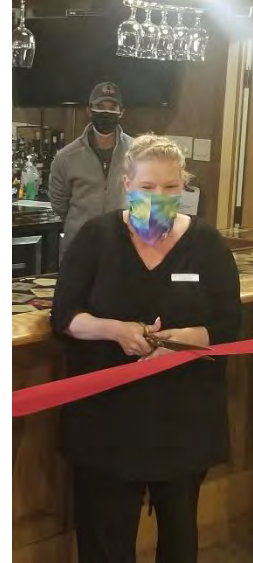
