## **Special Lecture at Fort Caspar Museum** ***“Pronghorn Passage”***

Casper, Wyoming – Fort Caspar Museum and Fort Caspar Museum Association are hosting a “Lunch and Learn” on Saturday, June 12<sup>th</sup>. The presentation “Pronghorn Passage” by Emilene Ostlind and Joe Riis explores their journey as they walked the 300-mile migration corridor of the pronghorn antelope to document one of the world’s greatest long-distance migrations. Ostlind is an essayist and student in the MFA creative writing program at the University of Wyoming. Riis is a wildlife photographer and a recipient of the National Geographic Young Explorer award.
