Incidents by Day of Week







Landfill Fire

All Times Approximant:

10-10-15

(5:35 p.m.) Fire Department receives 911 call of "Refuse Fire" at the 1886 North Station Road (City Of Casper Landfill). Fire Department arrives on scene and reports large open burning of wood chip piles and request additional units plus mutual aid from outside fire departments. Mutual aid, risk management, chief officers requested.

(8:00 p.m.) 300,000 gallons of water was applied using department master streams having little effect on the wood chip piles and large equipment is brought in to tear apart wood chip piles. Reserve Engine, B2 remain on scene to knock down open flames while large equipment is working throughout the night.

11-11-15

(11:50 a.m.) Reserve Engine 2, B2 report that winds are picking up and the fire is growing despite their best effects. F1, B12, B2, E2, E3 engage the larger fires.

(1 p.m.) More additional units arrive E5, B5.

(2 p.m.) The fire edge crosses the control line (landfill road) and starts grass on fire north east outside the landfill fence. This is call slop-over in wildland fires. More multiple mutual aid request and BLM reports no air resources are available.

October 17, 2015

The Senior Fall and Fire Prevention Initiative is a community partnership dedicated to installing smoke alarms for seniors in our community as well as providing education to help prevent fires and falls. Firefighters from around the county installed alarms in over 20 homes on Saturday (October 17, 2015) along with volunteers from the community who visited another 50 homes! That's nearly 80 altogether with another 20 homes scheduled throughout the rest of the month.

The Senior Fall and Fire Prevention Coalition members include Reveille Rotary, Casper Rotary Foundation, Blue Envelope Health Fund, Casper-Natrona Health Department, Casper Senior Health Network, AARP Wyoming, and each of the Fire Departments serving Natrona County.

October 18, 2015

Casper Fire-EMS responded to a structure fire at approximately 12:00 am in the 5800 block of South Chestnut. Firefighters arrived to find all occupants evacuated and a fire inside the garage. Crews gained access to the fire and extinguished it a short time later. No injuries have been reported. Crews remain on scene and the cause is currently being determined by Casper Fire investigators. It is unknown at this time the extent of damage or if the occupants will be able to return to their home immediately. 17 personnel initially responded. CFEMS was assisted by Casper Police and Wyoming Medical Center.

B Shift Engines 5, 6, 1 and Rescue 1 training on extrication. They worked on a technique known as "cracking the egg" or the "car taco". It is a method of accessing patients in a top resting rollover accident. In the case of significant crushing of the roof or limited access, it can be used to open the vehicle providing significant access inside. It is based on cutting appropriate locations on the vehicle along with relief cuts and a mechanical advantage system to open it in a controlled manner. E&F Towing provided the vehicles for the training.
