### Incidents by Day of Week



# Casper Fire-EMS Activity Report February 31, 2015

## **MSI:**

2/1/16 - Gas Leak:

At approximately 1:30 pm the Casper Fire-EMS department was called for the report of a Gas Leak at the intersection of SW Wyoming Blvd and Eagle Drive. Upon arrival the fire department found a large diameter natural gas line had been hit during excavation. The leak was underground where fire crews could not access and control it. The area was immediately evacuated and blocked off to traffic.

Source Gas is on scene and has developed a plan to control the leak and is working with Casper Fire units to accomplish that goal. Wyoming Blvd will remain closed from Talon Drive to Arroyo until work is completed. An estimated time of completion is not known at this time.

No injuries have been reported. Nearby buildings were assessed by the fire department for any possible problems and none were found.

Casper Fire-EMS is asking the public to stay clear of the area until the problem is resolved. We are asking those needing to pick up family at CY junior high to use Talon drive to access the school. If any other pertinent information becomes available we will release it at that time.

## *2/1/16 – E-Cig Fire*

Several units responded to 514 E. M street for a Structure Fire. This is an 8 plex apartment complex. The fire was contained to a bedroom. A family of three were displaced.

The fire that occurred last week here in Casper was linked to an E-Cigarette that was being charged. This model of electronic cigarette utilizes an “USB” type of charger and if a power source is used that is not approved by the manufacture it can cause the lithium-ion batteries to fail with heat and flames being emitted

## *2/8/15 - Structure Fire*

At about 3:00 PM Casper Fire-EMS was called to a structure fire in the 1600 block of East E Street. Crews arrived to find a fire in a structure that was part of a concrete batch plant that was undergoing demolition. Crews entered and extinguished a small fire. No injuries were reported as a result of the fire.

Fire Department Investigators have determined the cause to be accidental. They were able to determine through contact with the structure owner that it was undergoing demolition and that the cause of the fire was a result of metal cutting operations. No further investigation is planned.

In all, 16 personnel along with investigators initially responded. Crews were also assisted by Wyoming Medical Center, Casper Police and Natrona County Health Fire Rehab. Crews remained on scene a short time to complete extinguishment and investigation.
