Recommendation

That Council, by minute action, select a name for a new park located on Venture Way.

Summary

In August, staff solicited park name suggestions from the public via the City website. Residents were directed to suggest names that fit the following criteria:

- Names must not infringe on any trademarks or licensed product.
- Names associated with natural features of the landscape (rivers, wetlands, etc.), natural resource related attributes (wildlife, vegetation, geological feature), and historic significance (people or places) are preferred for park properties.
- Submissions should be one to three word names that are concise and distinctive from a regional standpoint.

Twenty-five suggestions were received. A committee consisting of the parks manager, two parks supervisors, and the community relations coordinator reviewed the names and are recommending two of those suggestions. Staff also added two suggestions to the list for a total of four (4) suggested names.

The suggested name along with their reasoning are listed in no particular order below:

Name Suggestion	Reasoning for Name	Staff Comments
Horizon Park	The horizon is visible from every area of the park	Clever and different name than other parks
Venture Way Park	The park is on this street	Many parks are named this way (Goodstein Park, Conwell Park, Buckboard Park, etc.)

Eastgate Park	Nearby area is called Eastgate	Many Parks are named after geographic area or features (Garden Creek Park, Westwood Park, Fairdale Park, etc.)
Pronghorn Park	Wyoming is home to one of the largest populations of Pronghorn and they still call this area home.	Parks have generally not been named after animals and this is a unique name for a park. Staff did express concern that since there is a Pronghorn Street in Casper, this name could cause confusion since many parks are named after the street on which they are located.

Council is not limited to the list of suggested names and may select a name of their own choosing. The Parks Division recommends that the name not be one that is close to another name in the park system to avoid citizen confusion.

Staff also received suggestions from the public on a name for the dog park within this new park. Parks staff is open to naming the dog park separately and signage would say "Dog Park at X Park". Suggested names included:

- Bark Place
- Central Bark
- Rio K-9 Park (This suggestion was to honor one of Casper Police Department's first K-9 dogs. Rio performed numerous demonstrations, school appearances, and had a prestigious police career).

A full list of all suggestions with submission and staff comments is attached for Council's review.

City Council review the requested information along with providing direction regarding this process before a recommendation from the review committee comes forth.

Summary

The deadline for proposals was October 9, 2020 at 4pm. Two proposals were received from Casper Horseheads and Spectra/Casper Baseball Club.

The Casper Horseheads would pay the City \$5,000 for the lease the first year along with a 5% escalator annually for the term of the lease. The Horseheads will pay the City 25% of charged user fees for other events (state tournaments, non-baseball events). The Horseheads will provide 3% of paid gross marketing sales and 3% of paid net concession revenues.

Spectra and the Casper Baseball Club would require a \$25,000 per year management fee and would share all revenues at an 80/20 split with 80% going to the City. Spectra is requesting that the contracts for the Events Center and Hogadon be extended to end at the same time in 2026.

Pursuant to the work session on October 27, 2020 staff was directed to provide more information regarding; Rates/Fees, Sponsorships, and Schedules.

Dear Phil,

Thank you for allowing us to provide detailed information regarding Spectra and Casper Baseball Club's outlined deal structure and future for Mike Lansing Field, we appreciate how diligent you have been throughout this process. After watching Tuesday evening's Council Meeting, we wanted to take the opportunity to reiterate and clarify the benefits of hiring Spectra and Casper Baseball Club for management of the Field.

First, we wanted to clearly state that Spectra is proposing to manage Mike Lansing Field on behalf of the City of Casper as opposed to leasing it and the City of Casper will hire Spectra to act as its agent. Spectra will work in the best interest of the City, no different than the successful structure we already have in place at the Casper Event Center. In this model, Spectra will work to maximize revenue potential through aggressive bookings and usage of the field, implementing creative food and beverage experiences, and selling sponsorship and advertising to our local and national corporate relationships. All revenues that are generated through this model will be retained by the City as opposed to an entity leasing the field. As outlined in the attached pro forma, we anticipate Mike Lansing Field operating at a \$75,000 profit in year one of our proposed agreement after paying Spectra its \$25,000 management fee.

Secondly, we heard a lot of discussion in Tuesday's meeting about scheduling and making sure the field is available for everyone. Our main priority for the field is to make sure youth baseball is properly served in the City of Casper, which is why we partnered with the Casper Baseball Club, ensuring that the 115 plus players spread across 8 teams have an opportunity to play in an affordable, safe environment. If the opportunity presents itself that a tenant would like to call Mike Lansing Field home, Spectra will negotiate a fair and equitable deal that would be in the best interest of the City, which is no different than what we do in many of the other 180+ buildings that we mange across North America. We will develop a comprehensive booking policy that the City will review and approve to make sure there are never schedule conflicts and everyone can use the field. For your review, we have developed a preliminary draft of a booking policy for Mike Lansing Field as a part of this submittal.

Lastly, one of the strongest benefits you will receive from Spectra are the unmatched resources and expertise we already have in place in the City of Casper through our operations at the Casper Events Center and Hogadon Ski Basin. We have already identified several synergies between the Field and our existing operation at Casper Events Center. Specifically, our Mike Lansing Field operation will benefit from support from Casper Events Center in the areas of event booking; event marketing and management; sales; promotions; operations; financial management, accounting, and reporting; legal; risk management; and human resources. As previously submitted and as a reminder, below and on the following page we have included a detailed breakdown of how Spectra's corporate and local team at Casper Events Center will support Mike Lansing Field.

MIKE LANSING FIELD EVENT BOOKING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

AVAILABLE DATES AND HOLD POLICY

- 1. Personnel Authorized to Give Out Available Dates and Place Holds The distribution of available dates and placement of holds will be handled directly by:
 - General Manager
 - Office Coordinator
 - Director of Food & Beverage (when appropriate)
 - Director of Event Services (when appropriate)

EVENT BOOKING POLICY

1. Personnel Authorized to Book Events

The scheduling of the Stadium for a concert or a Special Event will be handled directly by:

- General Manager (all concerts)
- Office Coordinator (when appropriate)
- the Food and Beverage Manager (when appropriate)
- 2. All bookings are on a first come, first serve basis.
- 3. Annual Events receive first preference for the same dates on the following year, provided all fees owed to the Casper Events Center are current and paid.
- 4. Primary baseball program tenants receive priority scheduling status. Tenants must provide the General Manager with a request for all practice, game and tournament dates in a timely manner. General Manager in cooperation with Tenants will identify available dates. General Manager has the final decision for confirmation of dates. Priority given to the clubs in the following order.
 - 1. Casper Baseball Club
 - 2. Summer Wood Bat League Team

Schedule to be developed in February preceding the baseball season

- 5. Information needed for calendar:
 - a. Name of person placing the hold/contact for the event
 - b. Company they represent
 - c. Name of the Event
 - d. Phone number for contact person





6. Protection for Date

a. Non-conflicting date is defined as:

EVENT BOOKING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES CONTINUED

No other similar event/concert. If first promoter approves of second show, then it will be acceptable.

b. Protection:

At General Manager's discretion, protection to promoter can be offered up to 30 days before and after for a similar event.

7. Challenge to Date

When a hold date is challenged, the Casper Events Center will notify the "hold" contact stating that their hold for that date is being challenged and in order to firm the date, it will be necessary for the party to submit the required deposit within forty-eight hours (2 working days). If the deposit is not received, the hold for that date will be released.

RENTAL RATES

The basic rental fee includes use of the field, dugouts, press box, and stadium seating. There will be a labor charge for greater than normal cleanup and/or setup requirements that are not normally associated with the event. Only the General Manager has authority to negotiate variations in rental rates.

Rates do not include any special requirements such as security, ticket takers, medical, , stagehands, riggers, runners, sound and light operators, exhibit/convention booth equipment, materials, etc. The number and identify of persons to be used in public service capacities shall be designated by the Casper Events Center General Manager. Rates for these services and additional equipment requested shall be charged at the current Casper Events Center reimbursable rate schedule.

Rental rates charged will be at the current rental rate in effect at the time the contract is signed. The contract will clearly state the rates that will apply. The lessee shall understand that charges for personnel and equipment provided by the Events Center are subject to change without notice.





RATE CATEGORIES

1. Commercial Rates

Use of the facility by a for-profit institution, agency, commercial promoter, business, or private enterprise.

2. Non-Profit and Local Government Rates

Rate applied to the Natrona County School District, Natrona County governmental agencies, Mills, Evansville, Bar Nunn, Midwest, Edgerton, the Wyoming Association of Municipalities and non-profit agencies located within Natrona County and registered with a federal tax exemption. Proof of tax exemption is required in advance of the event.

3. Other City of Casper Department Rates

Other City of Casper departments will not be charged for field and stadium rental, but will be charged for reimbursable labor, maintenance labor, food, beverage, and materials.
