Motion passed.

#### 8.A ORDINANCE—THIRD READING

Following ordinance read:

#### ORDINANCE NO. 5-21

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE VACATION OF EAST 7TH STREET BETWEEN SOUTH JACKSON STREET AND THE PUBLIC ALLEY BISECTING BLOCKS 62 AND 63, SHERIDAN HEIGHTS ADDITION.

WHEREAS, the City of Casper has received a request to vacate East 7th Street between South Jackson Street, and the public alley bisecting Blocks 62 and 63 of the Sheridan Heights Addition, as described in a survey attached hereto as Exhibit A, which by reference herein is hereby incorporated as fully set forth; and,

WHEREAS, upon the vacation of East 7th Street, two (2) utility easements shall be reserved, as described in Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, a petition containing the signatures of a majority of the owners who own a majority of the property abutting the segments of the right-of-way proposed to be vacated and extending 300 feet in all directions from the street to be vacated has been submitted to the City as provided by W. S. §15-4-305; and,

WHEREAS, signed consents have been submitted from all Casper utility companies agreeing to release and abandon the existing utility easement associated with the seventy (70) foot wide street right-of-way being vacated; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Casper has determined that the described portion of the East 7th Street right-of-way can be vacated without adversely impacting utility services or traffic circulation in the surrounding area; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body of the City of Casper to approve said vacation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CASPER, WYOMING:

#### SECTION 1:

That the vacation of East 7th Street between South Jackson Street and the public alley bisecting Blocks 62 and 63, Sheridan Heights Addition, as described in Exhibit A, is hereby approved.

#### **SECTION 2:**

Two (2) utility easements are hereby reserved within the vacated East 7th Street right-of-way, as described in Exhibit A.

#### **SECTION 3:**

That the vacated portion of public right-of-way (alley) shall revert to the adjoining land owners, as provided by law.

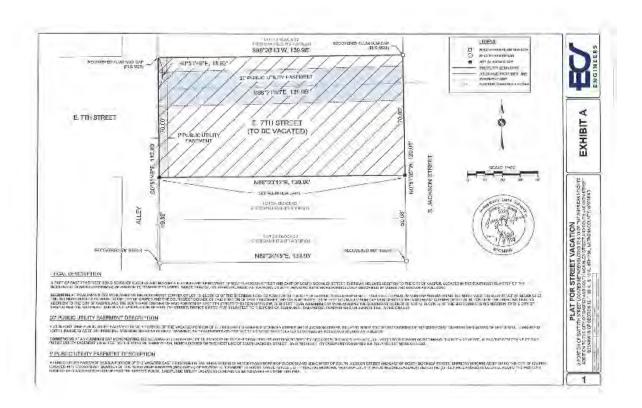
#### SECTION 4:

### ORDINANCE NO. 9-21

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 13.04.060 OF THE CASPER MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper may perform all acts in relation to the concerns of the City necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper has the authority granted by Wyoming State Statute §15-1-103(a)(xli), to adopt ordinances and resolutions necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the City and its citizenry; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 26-95, was adopted on September 5, 1995, creating Chapter 13.04 of the Casper Municipal Code concerning permits to construct, intall, or modify water distribution or sanitary sewer collection facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Casper Municipal Code needs modified and updated from time to time; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper desires to amend Section 13.04.060 of the Casper Municipal Code for the purpose of updating references to Wyoming Statutes within the Code that have since been repealed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CASPER, WYOMING: Section 13.04.060 – Application requirements and procedures is amended as follows:

13.04.060 - Application requirements and procedures.

The following procedures will be followed in an application for the permit:

- A. Any person who proposes to construct, install or modify a facility required to be permitted under Section 13.04.050 shall submit a written application on forms provided by the city of Casper.
- B. The initial application for a permit must be accompanied by two complete sets of plans and specifications, design data and any additional information required by the city. After the plans and specifications have been reviewed by the city, the applicant's engineer shall make such revisions as are required and submit five revised sets for final review. All plans and specifications submitted shall carry the seal or signature of the design engineer in accordance with Wyoming Statutes Sections 33-29-101 through 33-29-113 33-29-601 et seq. All plans and specifications shall conform to city of Casper Water Distribution Facilities Design Standards, city of Casper Sanitary Sewage Collection Facilities Design Standards, and the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Water Quality Rules and Regulations, Chapter XI and Chapter XII.

- C. The city shall review every application and take final action within thirty days from the date the application is received.
- D. If an application is incomplete, additional information shall be requested in detail, or if requested, the application may be returned to the applicant. The applicant shall have ninety days to comply with the request for additional information. After this time period, if no information is submitted, the entire application shall be returned.
- E. The city manager or his appointed designee shall promptly notify the applicant in writing of the final action taken on the application. If the conditions of the permit are different from the proposed application submitted by the applicant for review, the notification shall include reasons for the changes made.
- F. If, upon review of an application, the city determines that a permit is not required under this chapter, the city manager or his appointed designee shall notify the applicant of this determination in writing. Such notification shall constitute final action on the application.
- G. If, upon review of an application, the city determines that a permit should not be granted, the city manager or his appointed designee shall notify the applicant in writing of the permit denial and state the reasons for denial.
- H. If the applicant is dissatisfied with the conditions or denial of any permit issued by the city, he may request a hearing in accordance with Section 13.04.090.

The City of Casper, as property owner, is the applicant for the proposed vacation and replat creating the Central Services Addition No. 2. The sole purpose of the replat is to create a new eighty (80) foot wide right-of-way/street, to be known as Memorial Way. Memorial Way continues from the Central Services Addition No. 2, east, to connect to the VA Cemetery Road in Evansville, with the purpose of providing a secondary means of access/egress for Evansville. Presently, the Town of Evansville only has a single-point of ingress/egress, located at Curtis Street, just north of the Interstate. The Curtis Street access is vulnerable, in that it could become impassable if there were an accident within the rail corridor, thereby cutting off the Town. Construction of the secondary access road is planned for the summer of 2021.

The Planning and Zoning Commission voted to support the vacation and replat after a public hearing on February 18, 2021. There were no public comments either for or against the case.

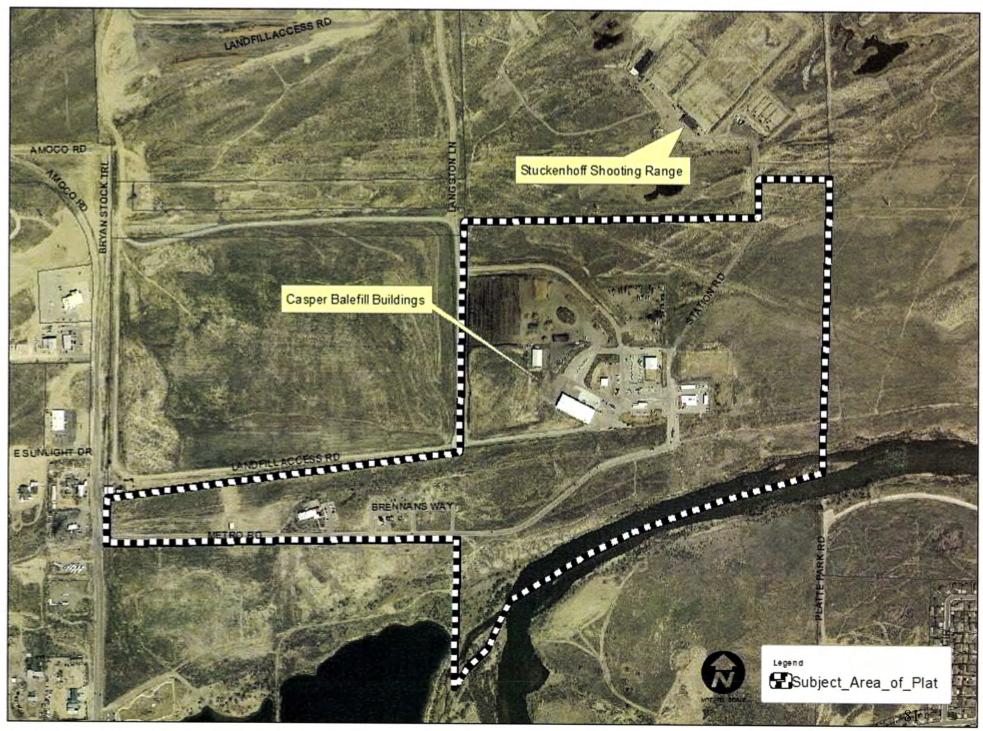

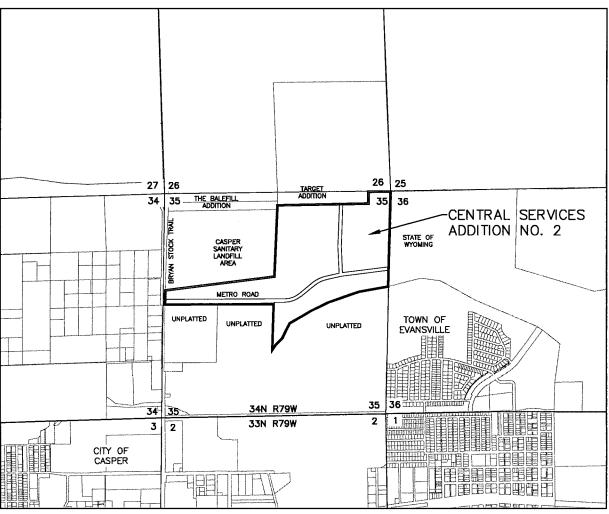
Location Map Aerial Map Plat

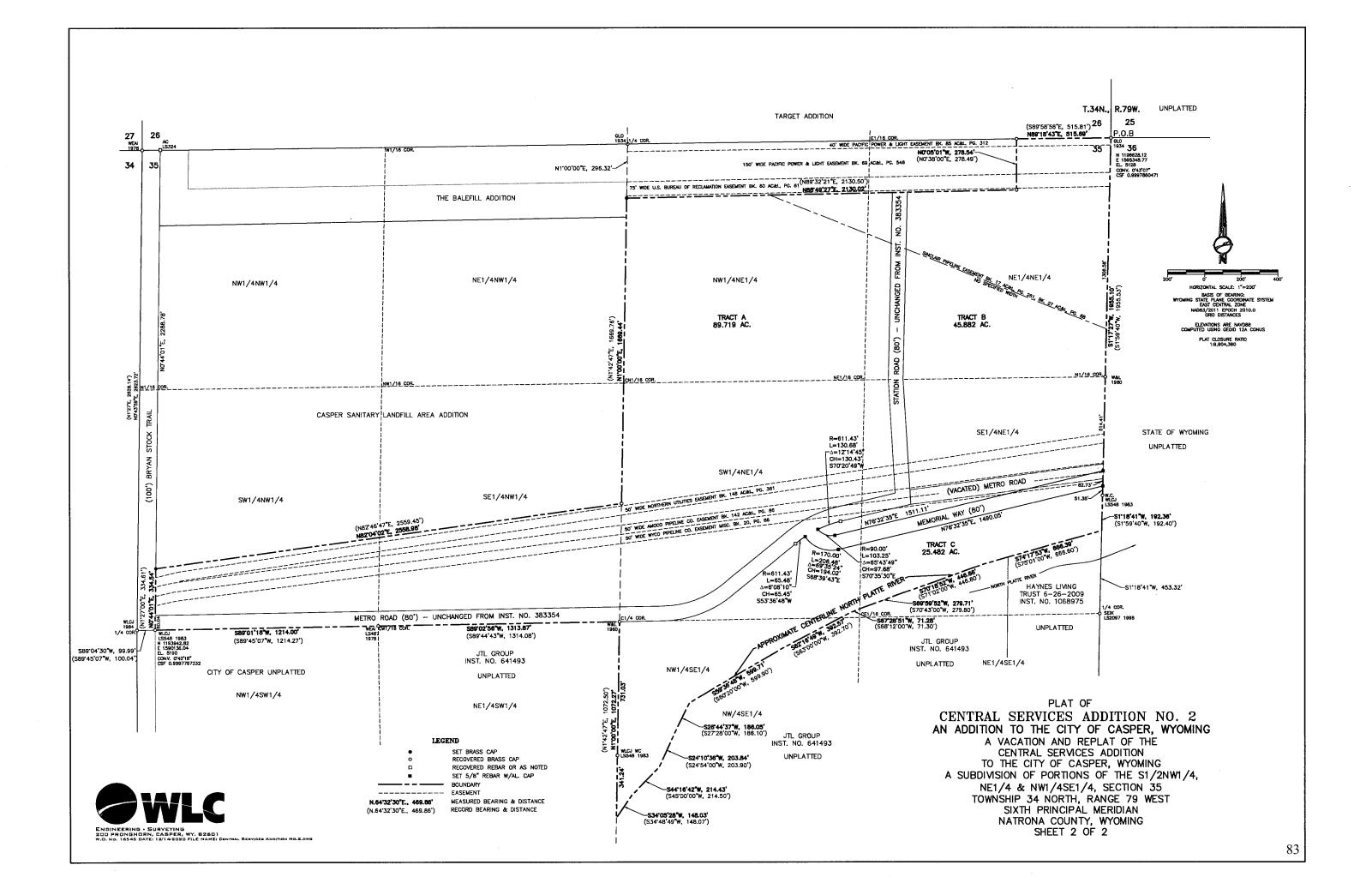

### **Meeting Type & Date**

### **Action Type**

Public Hearing Resolution

### Recommendation

That Council, by Resolution, authorize an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2021 Budget.

### **Summary**

The Municipal Budget Act, Section 16-4-108, prohibits the expenditure or encumbrance of any money in excess of the amounts provided in the budget for each department. To comply with this requirement, City Council may authorize an adjustment of budgets.

The budget amendment being proposed would be the fourth amendment to the originally adopted Fiscal Year 2020-2021 budget. If approved, this amendment would add \$23,104,409 of additional expenditure authority to the budget. For the purpose of a summary analysis, the proposed amendment is divided into the following seven categories:

### Transfers of existing financial resources between Funds

\$12,775,152 will be covered through the transfer of existing dollars between Funds. Much of this amount involves transactions related to the newly created Cares Act Fund. Creation of this fund was authorized by Council on December 15, 2020, in order to maintain a clear accounting record of expenditures and grant reimbursements associated with the COVID 19 virus. Prior to the creation of the Cares Act Fund, the \$11M+ in reimbursements already received had been deposited into the General Fund. This amendment will move those deposits from the General Fund into the Cares Act Fund. In addition, some COVID related expenditures had been paid from the General Fund for which a transfer of grant dollars from the Cares Act Fund back to the General Fund would be appropriate.

### Council authorized projects/disbursements

**\$4,586,196** is required to cover the costs of projects and disbursements for which Council direction has previously been given and budget expenditure authority is needed. Specific items, and the recommended funding source, in this category are:

- \$2,681,795 for City Hall Project Safe. Funding will come from a transfer of existing financial resources in the Revolving Land Fund (\$890k); the LAD Fund (\$1,677,306); and residual 1% #16 dollars allocated for this purpose.
- \$1,250,000 for the purchase of two Fire-EMS vehicles. Funding will be from 1% #16 dollars allocated for this purpose.
- \$482,404 for employee recompense associated with the Voluntary Unpaid Days/Furlough program implemented during the first half of this fiscal year, as previously authorized by Council. Funding will be from Cares Act grant receipts.
- \$171,997 to enable the Ford Wyoming Center to allow furloughed employees to return to work immediately and return salaries to normal levels. Funding will be from Cares Act grant receipts.

### Prior year approved transfers

\$4,552,023 for previously approved budget transfers. These budget transfers were authorized in the passage of fiscal year 2020 budget amendments but, for various reasons, the actual transfer of the funds never occurred within that year. These transfers must now be re-authorized in this fiscal year so that the funds can be made available for the intended purposes.

### FY '20 Carry Over Purchases

**\$442,901** for fiscal year 2020 authorized purchases. The following items were approved for purchase in the fy '20 budget year but funds were not spent or encumbered by fiscal year end. Funds must now be re-appropriated in fy '21 for authorized expenditure:

- \$353,673 for Striper Truck
- \$ 89,228 to equip police vehicles with communication technology equipment

### **Budgetary adjustments**

\$319,211 is the net amount being requested to cover budgetary shortfalls caused by unanticipated and higher than expected expenditures. The net amount includes a budgetary reduction of \$347,166 caused by over budgeting for a project.

- \$385,000 to cover the costs of catastrophic claims expense associated with City vehicle/property damage. Insurance reimbursements of \$352,000 are anticipated with the remaining \$33,000 to be covered by existing Property & Liability Fund reserves.
- \$176,500 to cover the cost of higher than anticipated truck and equipment repairs in the Refuse Fund. Funding will be from existing Refuse Fund reserves.
- \$104,877 other misc. adjustments
- (\$347,166) budgeted expense reduction. Fy'21 budgeted expense for project was overstated.

### New projects

**\$270,000** is included to provide funding for the following projects that were part of the fy '22 capital budget plan but, due to the critical need for timely completion, are being requested in the fy '21 budget:

• \$130,000 to cover the cost of air handling unit replacements at the City owned Senior Center building. Funding will be from existing capital reserves.

- \$70,000 for installation of roll-up garage doors at the 19<sup>th</sup> Hole. Funding will be from existing Golf Fund reserves.
- \$70,000 for the purchase of call center software to improve tracking and management of customer telephone calls. Funding will be from transfers of existing financial resources in the Water, Sewer, and Refuse Funds.

### New Appropriations with offsetting revenues

\$158,926 for unbudgeted expenditures for which there is offsetting revenues:

- \$134,000 Coates Road LAD (\$67,000 from Natrona County; \$67,000 private)
- \$ 10,000 AV system upgrades (funding provided through franchise fees)
- \$ 8,326 EUDL overtime expense (funded through EUDL grant)
- \$ 6,600 African American Cultural Study (offsetting grant revenue)

Products"

### **Action type**

Third Reading of Ordinance (postponed on March 2<sup>nd</sup> to March 16<sup>th</sup>)

### Recommendation

Consider and discuss each of the proposed amendments and decide if the proposed Ordinance should be passed and adopted on Third Reading.

### **Summary**

The concern raised at the last Council meeting, where there was substantive discussion on the proposed ordinance, focused on the lack of any real incentive or ability to help those under the age of eighteen (18) enroll in a nicotine education/cessation program.

### I. Information

Tobacco products and their derivatives are addictive, and can cause significant illness and disease. Addiction in the adolescent age group is particularly troublesome; neural pathways are being developed, skewing the individual's ability to make an unbiased "use or not use" decision later in life.

When a person indulges in addictive behavior, their brain floods with dopamine. Dopamine release is not only highly rewarding, it also increases the ability to learn this happened so you can feel this way again. As the behavior is performed again and again, the level of dopamine release decreases, and increased or more powerful use is necessary to obtain the same effect. Eventually, tolerance may build to such a point that the addictive behavior no longer provides pleasure at all—merely avoidance of withdrawal. But even in the face of diminished rewards, the

neural pathways beg for the repetition of the behavior; the brain is now built for addiction. (Kvarnstrom, E., Alta Mira Recovery © 2015)

Multiple sources have reached the same conclusion:

"Tobacco use typically begins in childhood or adolescence — 80% of smokers begin smoking by 18 years of age. Although two thirds of young people try cigarette smoking, only 20 to 25% of them become dependent daily smokers, usually as adults. Risk factors for smoking in childhood or adolescence include peer and parental influences, behavioral problems (e.g., poor school performance), personality characteristics (rebelliousness, risk taking, depression, and anxiety), and genetic influences. The risk of dependence increases when smoking begins early." (Benowitz, Neal, M.D., N. Engl. J. Med., 2010, June 17.)

Cigarette smoking remains a leading cause of preventable disease and premature death in the United States and other countries. On average, 435,000 people in the United States die prematurely from smoking-related diseases each year; overall, smoking causes 1 in 5 deaths. The chance that a lifelong smoker will die prematurely from a complication of smoking is approximately 50%.

Tobacco use is a major cause of death from cancer, cardiovascular disease, and pulmonary disease. Cigarette smoking is also a risk factor for respiratory tract and other infections, osteoporosis, reproductive disorders, adverse postoperative events and delayed wound healing, duodenal and gastric ulcers, and diabetes. (Benowitz, Neal, M.D., *N. Engl. J. Med.*, 2010, June 17.)

The combination of the physiological response with the adolescent behavioral component, puts adolescents at particular risk.

Risk taking and novelty seeking are hallmarks of typical adolescent behavior. Adolescents seek new experiences and higher levels of rewarding stimulation, and often engage in risky behaviors, without considering future outcomes or consequences. These behaviors can have adaptive benefits with regard to the development of independence and survival without parental protection, but also render the adolescent more vulnerable to harm. Indeed, the risk of injury or death is higher during the adolescent period than in childhood or adulthood, and the incidence of depression, anxiety, drug use and addiction, and eating disorders increases. Brain pathways that play a key role in emotional regulation and cognitive function undergo distinct maturational changes during this transition period. (Ann N Y Acad Sci., 2004 June; 1021: 27-32.)

Comparing smoking behavior of adolescents to that of adults may point to an enhanced sensitivity of the adolescent brain to the addictive properties of nicotine. Adolescents report symptoms of dependence even at low levels of cigarette consumption (Colby et al. 2000; Kandel and Chen 2000). The most susceptible youth lose autonomy over tobacco intake already within 1 or 2 days of first inhaling from a cigarette. Among adolescents the appearance of tobacco withdrawal symptoms and failed attempts to stop smoking can precede daily smoking dependence and appear even before consumption reaches two cigarettes per day (DiFranza et al. 2007). . .

The vulnerability to the rewarding effects of nicotine during adolescence may be explained by adolescent brain development. Structural and functional MRI data show earlier maturation of reward systems and much slower development of prefrontal cognitive control (Spear 2000; Chambers et al. 2003; Casey et al. 2005; Ernst et al. 2005; Ernst and Fudge 2009).

Compared with adults, adolescents are generally more motivated by rewards, are less averse to risks, and are more easily influenced by peers (Spear 2000; Steinberg 2005; Galvan et al. 2006). The same applies to estimation of health risks of smoking—adolescents have a more optimistic attitude regarding their smoking behavior than adults, believing that they "could smoke for a few years and then quit" if they wished (Arnett 2000). Lack of mature cognitive control in adolescents makes them also more susceptible to social pressure. The smoking behavior of parents, siblings, and friends leads to a higher risk of smoking among adolescents and this social influence decreases with age (Vink et al. 2003). Adolescents with ADHD symptoms, whose behavior is even more characterized by impulsive and risk-taking choices, are more likely to experiment with smoking and to become regular tobacco users (Tercyak et al. 2002; McClernon et al. 2008). ### II. Analysis of Statutes

The phrase "further regulation" and the word "standards"

The statute titled "Further regulation by local ordinance," is important. On the one hand it is generous:

W.S. § 14-3-308 (a):

"Except as specified under subsection (b) of this section, this article shall not be construed to prohibit the imposition by local law or ordinance of further regulation or prohibition upon the sale, use and possession of nicotine products to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age in violation of this article."

From this, the Legislature anticipated that localities may want to and could impose further regulation.

However, the statute's constraint upon localities (W.S. § 14-3-308(b)), in addressing the purchase, use, and possession of nicotine products prohibits changes to the "standards" provided within sections 14-3-304(a) and 14-3-305(a). The referenced sections state:

W.S. § 14-3-308(b):

"No governmental entity shall enact any law or ordinance which changes the standards provided by W.S. 14-3-302(a) and (c), 14-3-303(a), 14-3-304(a) and 14-3-305(a)."

### W.S. § 14-3-304(a):

"No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall purchase or attempt to purchase nicotine products, or misrepresent his identity or age, or use any false or altered identification for the purpose of purchasing or attempting to purchase nicotine products. A person shall not be arrested for an alleged violation of this subsection but shall be issued a citation as a charging document by a peace officer having probable cause to believe the person violated this subsection. An officer issuing a citation shall deposit one (1) copy of the citation with the court having jurisdiction over the alleged offense. Bond may be posted and forfeited for an offense charged under this section in an amount equal to the fine imposed by subsection (b) of this section."

### W.S. § 14-3-305(a):

"It is unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to possess or use any nicotine products. A person shall not be arrested for an alleged violation of this subsection but shall be issued a citation as a charging document by a peace officer having probable cause to believe the person violated this subsection. An officer issuing a citation shall deposit one (1) copy of the citation with the court having jurisdiction over the alleged offense. Bond may be posted and forfeited for an offense charged under this section in an amount equal to the fine imposed by subsection (b) of this section."

The word "standards" in this context seems to mean a criterion, gauge or yardstick; described as a measure established by authority. In this context, the phrase "high standards" comes to mind, e.g. do not diminish the high standards that have been set.

Of note, the Legislature only referred to subparagraphs (a) in both statutes, not paragraphs (b), establishing the punishment, not paragraphs (c), providing for alternative punishments and not paragraphs (d), discussing conviction and expungement.

Thus the framework that would permit Casper to focus on emphasizing education, with the goal of promoting nicotine cessation, should not diminish the standards contained within the quoted subparagraphs (a) above and should incorporate the principles that form the basis for the State's statutory scheme.

### III. Proposed Amendments

The proposed amendments address modification of the punishment to violations of the possession, purchase, and use of tobacco or nicotine products for persons under the age of (18) eighteen.

In the suggested amendments, the punishment for the first violation is to attend a nicotine education and cessation course approved by the Municipal Court. There would be a small fee for the course to reduce the number of no shows, no greater than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

If there were a second violation, a different class, a substance use/intervention class would be required. There would be a small fee for the course, no greater than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

For the third and subsequent violations, the persons under the age of eighteen (18) would need to perform between ten to twenty (10-20) hours of community service, as determined by the Court. The imposition of the customary ten dollars (\$10.00) in Court costs could be imposed as determined by the Court.

The rationale of the suggested amendments, do not diminish the standards referenced by the statutes, and the principle of affordable punishment is respected and incorporated.

### IV. Background

On July 1, 2020, Wyoming State Statutes § 14-3-301 et. seq., went into effect; these Statutes, which were passed by the Legislature and are the controlling law, prohibit the sale of nicotine products to persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years old, as well as the purchase, possession and use of nicotine products by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years old.

The current Ordinance is extremely outdated; it was adopted over twenty (20) years ago, and does not address new types of vaping products, and similar products, that have since become available.

The proposed ordinance significantly incorporates the State Statutes, which recently became effective.

The proposed ordinance incorporates punishments that are consistent with the punishments included in the statutes. As shown on the graph below, the fine increases would affect businesses who violate the ordinance in terms of certain notices required to be posted by businesses, as well as employees who sell or deliver nicotine products to individuals under twenty-one (21) years of age.

Punishments for prohibited purchase, possession, and use by individuals would decrease significantly if the proposed ordinance is adopted.

### V. History and Comparison

Under the current Ordinance a fine for a second or third violation can be imposed if a subsequent violation occurred within one year. The proposed Ordinance would set the time period two years from the subsequent violation.

The proposed Ordinance introduces a new expungement provision (consistent with the State Statute) for persons who plead guilty to, or are convicted of underage purchase, use, or possession of nicotine products; upon satisfaction of the punishment there is an automatic expungement of convictions from the Court record after six (6) months of entry of conviction.

A full copy of the proposed Ordinance is attached to this Memo. The current Casper Code is published online by MuniCode and can be accessed by the public.

### **Financial Considerations**

Increased punishment for individuals who sell or deliver nicotine products to persons twenty (20) years old and under. Decrease in punishment for persons twenty (20) years old and under for purchasing, possessing and using nicotine products.

### ORDINANCE NO.6-21

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 54-00 AS CODIFIED BY ARTICLE IV, CHAPTER 9.40 OF THE CASPER MUNICIPAL CODE AND CREATING A NEW ARTICLE IV – OF CHAPTER 9.40 OF THE CASPER MUNICIPAL CODE TITLED "SALE OF NICOTINE PRODUCTS".

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper has the authority granted by Wyoming State Statute §15-1-103(a)(xiii) and (xli) to adopt ordinances and resolutions necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the City and of its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper may perform all acts in relation to the concerns of the City necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2020, Wyoming Statutes §§ 14-3-301 et. seq, prohibit the sale of nicotine and tobacco products to persons under twenty-one years old and the purchase, possession and use of and nicotine and tobacco products by persons under twenty-one years of age; and

WHEREAS, the Casper Municipal Code needs updated and modified from time to time; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Casper desires to repeal Ordinance No. 54-00 as codified by Article IV, Chapter 9.40 of the Casper Municipal Code, and Create a new Article IV of Chapter 9.40 of the Casper Municipal Code titled "Sale of Nicotine Products" for the purpose of consistency between the Wyoming State Statutes and the Casper Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CASPER, WYOMING:

<u>Section 1:</u> Chapter 9.40 Offenses by or Against Minors – Article IV – Sale of Tobacco (Sections 9.40.150 through 9.40.190), is repealed and to be replaced by Section 2 of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 2:</u> Chapter 9.40 Offenses by or Against Minors – Article IV titled "Sale of Nicotine Products" (Sections 9.40.150 through 9.40.190) is hereby created and shall be codified as follows:

9.40.150 - Definitions.

A. As used in this article:

- 1. "Tobacco products" means any substance containing tobacco leaf or any product made or derived from tobacco that contains nicotine including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco or dipping tobacco;
- 2. "Vending machine" means any mechanical, electric or electronic self-service device which, upon insertion of money, tokens, or any other form of payment, dispenses nicotine products;
- 3. "Retailer" means a business of any kind at a specific location that sells nicotine products to a user or consumer;
- 4. "Self service display" means any display of nicotine products that is located in an area where customers are permitted and where the nicotine products are readily accessible to a customer without the assistance of a salesperson;
- 5. "Electronic cigarette" means any device that can be used to deliver aerosolized or vaporized nicotine or synthetic nicotine material to the person using the device and includes any component, part and accessory of the device and any vapor material intended to be aerosolized or vaporized during the use of the device. "Electronic cigarette" includes, without limitation, any electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, electronic hooka, vapor pen and any similar product or device. "Electronic cigarette" does not include a battery or battery charger if sold separately from the electronic cigarette and does not include any product regulated as a drug or device by the United States food and drug administration under subchapter V of the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act;
- 6. "Nicotine products" means tobacco products and electronic cigarettes;
- 7. "Vapor material" means any liquid solution or other material containing nicotine or synthetic nicotine that is depleted as an electronic cigarette is used. "Vapor material" includes liquid solution or other material containing nicotine or synthetic nicotine that is sold with or inside an electronic cigarette.

### 9.40.160 – Prohibited sales or delivery

- A. No individual shall sell, offer for sale, give away or deliver nicotine products to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years.
- B. Any individual violating subsection A. of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than:

- C. No retailer shall sell, permit the sale, offer for sale, give away or deliver nicotine products to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years.

  - 1. Two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for a first violation committed within a twenty-four (24) month period;
  - 2. Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for a second violation committed within a twenty-four (24) month period;
  - 3. Seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for a third or subsequent violation committed within a twenty- four (24) month period.
- E. Nothing in this Municipal Code Chapter shall modify or limit the provisions for injunctive relief pursuant to Wyoming Statutes §14-3-302 (e).
- F. It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under subsections A. and C. of this section that, in the case of a sale, the person who sold the nicotine product was presented with, and reasonably relied upon, an identification card which identified the person buying or receiving the nicotine product as being over twenty-one (21) years of age.
- G. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection D. of this section, no fine for a violation of subsection C. of this section shall be imposed for a first offense in a twenty-four (24) month period if the retailer can show it had:
  - 1. Adopted and enforced a written policy against selling nicotine products to persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years;
  - 2. Informed its employees of the applicable laws regarding the sale of nicotine products to persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years;

- 3. Required employees to verify the age of nicotine product customers by way of photographic identification or by means of electronic transaction scan device; and
- 4. Established and imposed disciplinary sanctions for noncompliance.

### 9.40.170 Posted notice required; location of vending machines

If the court finds that the respondent in the action has violated the provisions of subsection (a) or (b) of this section for a third or subsequent time within a two (2) year period and may continue to violate such provisions, it may grant an injunction prohibiting the respondent from selling nicotine products from vending machines or from the establishment where the violation occurred for a period of not more than one hundred eighty (180) days. For the purposes of this subsection, multiple violations occurring before the petition for the injunction is filed shall be deemed part of the violation for which the injunction is sought. If the person against whom the injunction is sought operates multiple, geographically separate establishments or vending machines, the injunction shall apply only to the establishment where the violation occurred and to the vending machines resulting in the violation. The injunction shall prohibit all sales of nicotine products from the vending machines or the establishment involved in the violation, regardless of any change in ownership or management of the vending machines or the establishment that is not a bona fide, arms length transaction while the injunction is in effect.

An officer issuing a citation shall deposit one (1) copy of the citation with the court having jurisdiction over the alleged offense. Bond may be posted and forfeited for an offense charged under this section in an amount equal to the fine imposed by subsection (b) of this section.
- (b) Any person violating subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

# § 14-3-307. Compliance inspections

Effective: July 1, 2020 Currentness

- (a) The department of health, working with local law enforcement agencies and other local individuals and organizations at the discretion of the department, shall be the lead agency to ensure compliance with this article.
- (b) The department of health shall develop strategies to coordinate and support local law enforcement efforts to enforce all state statutes relating to the prohibition of the sale of nicotine products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.
- (c) The department shall have discretion to:
  - (i) Work with each local law enforcement agency; and
  - (ii) Coordinate local enforcement efforts that appropriately reflect the needs of the community.
- (d) To coordinate the enforcement of state statutes relating to the prohibition of the sale of nicotine products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age and to comply with applicable federal law, the department of health shall have authority to contract with or provide grants to local law enforcement agencies or other local individuals or entities having the appropriate level of enforcement authority on the local level to conduct random, unannounced inspections at retail locations where nicotine products are sold. The local law enforcement agencies or other local individuals or entities authorized to conduct inspections shall be permitted to use minors and persons under twenty-one (21) years of age subject to the following:
  - (i) Prior to the inspection, the local law enforcement agency or other authorized individual or entity shall obtain the written consent of the person being used in the inspection or if using a minor, the written consent of the minor's parents or guardian shall be obtained prior to the minor participating in an inspection. The written consent required under this paragraph shall include a notification that testimony in a subsequent court proceeding may be required;
  - (ii) Any person under twenty-one (21) years of age participating in an inspection shall, if questioned, state his true age and that he is less than twenty-one (21) years of age;
  - (iii) The appearance of a person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall not be altered to make him appear to be twentyone (21) years of age or older;

(iv) Neither a minor nor his parents or guardians shall be coerced into participating in such inspections; (v) The person conducting the inspection shall photograph the participant immediately before the inspection and any photographs taken of the participant shall be retained by the person conducting the inspection; (vi) Any participant in an inspection under this section shall be granted immunity from prosecution under W.S. 14-3-304 or 14-3-305. (e) The person conducting an inspection under this section shall: (i) Remain within sight or sound of the participant attempting to make the purchase; (ii) Immediately inform in writing a representative or agent of the business establishment that an inspection has been performed and the results of the inspection; (iii) Within two (2) days, prepare a report of the inspection containing: (A) The name of the person who supervised the inspection; (B) The age and date of birth of the participant who assisted in the inspection; (C) The name and position of the person from whom the participant attempted to purchase nicotine products; (D) The name and address of the establishment inspected; (E) The date and time of the inspection; and (F) The results of the inspection, including whether the inspection resulted in the sale or distribution of, or offering for sale, nicotine products to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. (iv) Immediately upon completion of the report required under this subsection, provide a copy of the report to a representative or agent of the business establishment that was inspected; (v) Request a law enforcement officer to issue a citation for any illegal acts relating to providing nicotine products to persons

under twenty-one (21) years of age during the inspection.

# § 14-3-308. Further regulation by local ordinance

Effective: July 1, 2020 Currentness

- (a) Except as specified under subsection (b) of this section, this article shall not be construed to prohibit the imposition by local law or ordinance of further regulation or prohibition upon the sale, use and possession of nicotine products to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, but the governmental entity shall not permit or authorize the sale, use or possession of nicotine products to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age in violation of this article.
- (b) No governmental entity shall enact any law or ordinance which changes the standards provided by W.S. 14-3-302(a) and (c), 14-3-303(a), 14-3-304(a) and 14-3-305(a).
- (c) The governmental entity may require that sellers of nicotine products obtain a license to sell nicotine products and may deny or revoke the license in the case of reported violations of W.S. 14-3-302 or similar local ordinance.

# § 14-3-309. Regulation of mail order and internet purchases and sales; proof of age; penalties

Effective: July 1, 2020 Currentness

- (a) No person shall sell at retail or wholesale any nicotine product through the internet or any other remote sales method to any person in this state, other than a vendor licensed under W.S. 39-15-106, unless the seller performs an age verification on the purchaser through an independent third party age verification service. The age verification service utilized shall compare information available from public records to the personal information entered by the purchaser during the ordering process to establish that the purchaser is twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- (b) No person shall sell at retail or wholesale any nicotine product through the internet or any other remote sales method to any person in this state, other than a vendor licensed under W.S. 39-15-106, unless the seller uses a method of mailing or shipping that, upon delivery, requires the signature of a person at least twenty-one (21) years of age before the nicotine product will be released for delivery.
- (c) The provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall not apply if the seller employs one (1) of the following protections to ensure age verification:
  - (i) The purchaser is required to create an online profile or account with personal information verifying that the purchaser is at least twenty-one (21) years of age including, but not limited to, the purchaser's name, address and a valid phone number, if that personal information is verified by the seller through publicly available records and delivery is made to the same name and address; or
  - (ii) The purchaser is required to upload a copy of the purchaser's government issued identification and a current photograph of the purchaser verifying that the purchaser is at least twenty-one (21) years of age and delivery is made to the same name on the identification provided.
- (d) Any person violating subsection (a) or (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable as provided in W.S. 14-3-302(b).

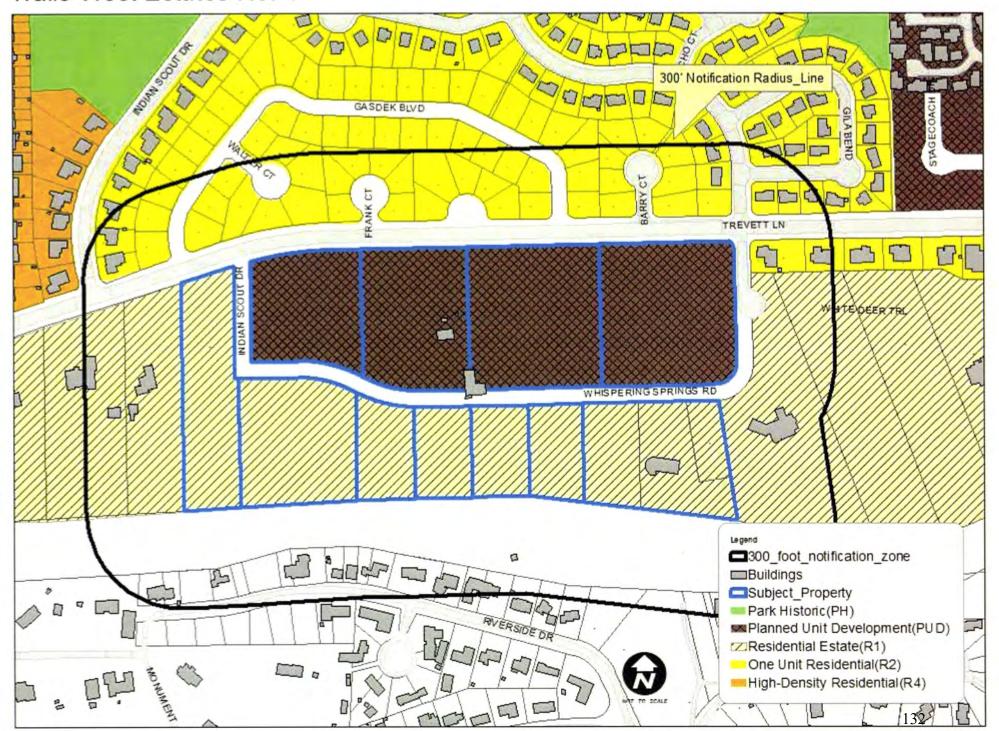

# TRAILS WEST ESTATES NO. 4 ADDITION SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT

Th	is Subdivision Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this
day of	, 2021, by and between the following parties:

- 1. The City of Casper of Casper, Wyoming, a Wyoming municipal corporation, 200 North David Street, Casper, Wyoming 82601 ("City").
- 2. Lukas M. Munsell and Amy J. Munsell, husband and wife, 6758 Whiskey Gap Road, Casper, Wyoming 82604 ("Owner").
- 3. Steven Paul and Paulette Joan Carlson, Trustees under the Steve and Polly Carlson Revocable Trust dated June 15, 2012, 6642 Riverside Drive, Casper, Wyoming 82604 ("Owner").
- 4. Charles J. Pater, 6505 Indian Scout Drive (to be re-addressed as 3997 Whispering Springs Road), Casper, Wyoming 82604 ("Owner").

Throughout this Agreement, City and Owner may be individually referred to as a "party" or collectively referred to as the "parties."

#### **RECITALS**

- A. Whenever the Public Services Director, City Engineer, Community Development Director, or other City official is mentioned in this Agreement, it shall be deemed to include their designees.
- B. Owner has applied for a vacation and replat of Lots 1-4, Block 16, Cottonwood Addition, Lots 13-19, Block 17, Trails West Estates, and Lot 20A, Block 17, Trails West Estates No. 3, and Lot 14 of Lots 8-14, Block 17, Trails West Estates No. 2, and the Westerly Portion of Indian Scout Drive, and the southerly portion of Whispering Springs Road to create the Trails West Estates No. 4 Addition. Lukas M. Munsell and Amy J. Munsell, husband and wife, 6758 Whiskey Gap Road, Casper, Wyoming 82604, owners of Lots 15 and 16, per the Replat ("Owners").
- C. A plat of Trails West Estates No. 4 ("Addition") has been prepared by the Owner, and approved by the City of Casper, and shall be signed and recorded at the Natrona County Clerk's Office concurrently with this Agreement.
- D. With respect to the properties within the Trails West Estates No. 4 Addition only, all previous City of Casper Subdivision Agreements are superseded by this Agreement, and all former requirements pertaining to the construction of Indian Scout Drive are null and void.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

### SECTION 1 – INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated at this point as if fully set forth as part of this Agreement.

# **SECTION 2 - OBLIGATIONS OF OWNER**

Upon written demand of the Council or the City Manager, the Owner, its heirs, successors, grantees or assigns, at their sole cost and expense, shall do, or cause to be done, the following:

# 2.1 <u>Surveying</u>:

- a. All subdivision corners shall be marked with 3½ brass caps. These caps shall show the name of the surveyor or company making the survey, and the license number of the surveyor making the survey or certifying the survey. All PLSS corners shall be properly marked for identification as to the location in accordance with Wyoming Statutes and Rules and Regulations of the Wyoming Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors, shall be referenced if subject to destruction, and again shall show the proper identification and license of the certifying surveyor. A corner record shall be recorded as per Wyoming Statutes and Rules and Regulations of the Wyoming Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors. A copy will be provided to the City upon recordation.
- b. Block and Lot corners, points of tangency (PT's) and points of curve (PC's) of all curves shall be marked by an iron pin not less than five-eighths (5/8) inches in diameter and not less than twenty-four (24) inches in length, with a brass or aluminum cap not less than 2 and one-half (2½) inches in diameter securely fastened to the top, unless otherwise impractical. These monuments will be set prior to the recording of the plat in the Office of the County Clerk unless approved by the City Surveyor.
- c. Said corners shall be in place for final inspection by the Public Services Director upon completion of the sidewalk (curbwalk), or curb and gutter.
- d. A digital copy of the Final Subdivision Plat shall be provided to the City, as required by the Casper Municipal Code ("Code"). No building permit shall be issued prior to the recording of the plat.

### 2.2 Construction Sequence:

Main water lines, sewer lines, storm sewer, streets, sidewalks, pavement overlays, and access drives shall be constructed in an orderly sequence, as the Addition is developed and built upon, so that there will be no gaps left in the paving, sidewalks, and other off-site improvements. Streets shall not be paved until all water lines, storm sewers, and property water and sewer services are in place and the ditches thereof properly backfilled and compacted, in accordance with City requirements. The Owner shall receive the approval of the Public Services Director prior to commencing any and all phases of construction.

### 2.3 Certification of Construction; Repair Obligations:

- a. All improvements shall be designed and inspected by a Wyoming registered professional engineer, who shall certify that the improvements, including, but not limited to, streets, curbs, gutter, sidewalks, paving, parkways, utility systems, storm sewers, street lighting, street signs and striping, etc., have been constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Public Services Director. The certification by the engineer and approval by the City shall be in writing. Approval of the construction plans by the Public Services Director is required before a building permit will be issued by the City.
- b. The Owner shall maintain, repair, and replace all improvements that fail within the warranty period as provided by the Code. This obligation includes maintenance, repair or replacement for any cause during such period, including acts of subcontractors. In the event the Owner fails to maintain, repair, or replace said improvements, the City shall have the right but not the obligation, at its option, to maintain, repair, or replace the same and Owner agrees to pay for any cost incurred thereby. Maintenance, repair, or replacement by the City does not relieve the Owner from its obligation under this paragraph and shall not be construed to be an acceptance of the improvements by the City.
- c. Upon issuance of a "letter of acceptance" by the Public Services Director pursuant to the Code, the City will assume ownership and the responsibility for the maintenance of the improvements. The Owner shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the improvements until the City issues its "letter of acceptance."

### 2.4 Underground Utilities and Street Lights:

All new utilities shall be located underground. All street lights shall be installed in compliance with Code street-lighting standards at the Owner's sole expense.

Streetlight pole materials shall be as approved in writing by the Public Services Director.

# 2.5 Soils Analysis:

The Owner shall provide the Public Services Director with a soils analysis concurrently with the submittal of subdivision construction plans. Individual lot test bores may be required on each lot, with a soil analysis for the foundation design at the sole discretion of the Public Services Director. Test results, soil analyses and foundation designs shall be submitted to the Community Development Director.

# 2.6 <u>Erosion Control Program</u>:

- a. The Owner shall submit, and have approved by the Public Services Director, a comprehensive erosion control program for the area disturbed during construction activities to mitigate the adverse effects of blowing dirt or dust, and water erosion on other properties in the immediate area before the issuance of an earthwork, road cut or grading permit pursuant to the Code. An erosion and sediment control permit shall be obtained from the Public Services Director prior to any earthwork taking place in the Addition.
- b. The Owner shall post security for its erosion control as required by the Code, and in a form acceptable to the City. It shall be the obligation of the Owner to keep any security in full force and effect, as required by the Code. In addition, the Owner shall furnish proof of the same to the Public Services Director upon demand of the City.

### 2.7 Retaining Walls and Fences:

Any retaining walls constructed within the subdivision by the Owner shall be designed and certified by a Wyoming registered professional engineer. The design(s) shall be submitted to the Public Services Director and Community Development Director for written approval before a building permit will be issued. Said walls shall be constructed within the boundaries of each lot and not on the property lines. Maintenance of said walls shall be the responsibility of each individual lot owner. Provided, however, retaining walls and fences shall not be constructed on any drainage easements, or on any other ways depicted on any other recorded instrument without the approval of the Public Services Director.

### 2.8 Water and Sewer:

All water and sewer improvements shall be constructed in full compliance with the Code as it exists at the time of construction, including, but not limited to the following requirements:

- a. Curb boxes shall be left behind the sidewalk in front of each lot and the Owner shall protect, during the subsequent course of developing the Addition, valve boxes and curb boxes from damage, and be wholly responsible for the repair and replacement to the Public Services Director's satisfaction of such that are damaged or destroyed. If the Owner shall fail or refuse to promptly repair or replace such boxes as required, the City may do so and charge the Owner directly for said cost. The Owner shall adjust said valve and curb boxes to finished grade, at the time the paving work is completed in the Addition.
- b. The Owner shall construct the necessary water lines and appurtenances up to and through the Addition. All work shall be in accordance with plans and specifications to be prepared by the Owner's engineer and approved in writing by the Public Services Director. Water line sizes shall be as determined by the Public Services Director.
- c. The Owner, at its cost, shall install water service lines in accordance with Code specifications to the property line so as to serve each lot or building site in the Addition.
- d. The Owner shall construct the necessary sewer lines up to and through the Addition. All work shall be in accordance with plans and specifications to be prepared by the Owner's engineer and approved in writing by the Public Services Director. Sewer sizes shall be as determined by the Public Services Director.
- e. The Owner, at its own cost, shall install sewer service lines, in accordance with Code specifications, to the property line so as to serve each lot or building site in the Addition.
- f. The Owner shall protect manhole covers and rings from damage in the course of constructing the line, and shall be solely responsible for repair or replacement to the Public Services Director's satisfaction. The Owner shall adjust such manhole rings and covers to finished grade. The Owner agrees to protect and save the City harmless from any loss or claim suffered by other sewer users to their real or personal property, and from personal injury or damages by reason of obstruction or damage to the sewer lines or any part thereof occasioned by present or future construction work on said Addition by the Owner. Said obligation shall continue until the sewer line and the system within the Addition is accepted by the Public Services Director by issuance of a "letter of acceptance." Provided, however, that acceptance of part of the system shall not relieve the Owner of the obligations herein imposed for the remaining improvements that have not been accepted within said Addition.
- g. Prior to the issuance of a building permit for any new structure, or prior to the issuance of a plumbing permit to connect existing buildings to the water and sewer systems, the then-existing water system investment charge (connection charge), sewer system investment charge (connection charge) and water meter charge shall be paid to the City. The Owner will also pay to the Central

Wyoming Regional Water System Joint Powers Board the then current Regional Water System investment charge for each building to be served with water.

- h. All necessary water and sewer easements, in forms acceptable to the City, up to and through the subdivision shall be obtained by the Owner, which grant to the City the right of ingress and egress thereto for purposes of laying out, constructing, inspecting, maintaining and replacing water lines, sewer lines, its fire hydrants and other appurtenances.
- i. The Owner agrees to abide by all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations regarding the use of its water and sewer facilities, and water and sewer service, including, but not limited to, the Federal Pretreatment Regulations and all the Code sections relating to industrial pretreatment.
- j. At such time as said water and/or sewer mains are installed by the Owner and a "letter of acceptance" is issued by the Public Services Director, the City shall pursuant to the Code, reimburse the Owner twice the difference in material cost between an eight (8) inch water and/or sewer main, or larger size if required by the development, and the required oversized main pursuant to the Code, as amended. Such reimbursement will be determined by the City based upon its most recent applicable material costs at the time of the Agreement execution. Reimbursement will only be based on oversizing of water and sewer mains larger than the size required by system analysis and approved by the Public Services Director.
- k. Notwithstanding the foregoing and being that Charles J. Pater currently has valid, legal and previously paid for water and sewer services connected to the respective City mains off of Trevett Lane near Whispering Springs Road, if Charles J. Pater chooses in the future to relocate his water and sewer services, he will not be charged for the water system investment charge (connection charge), sewer system investment charge (connection charge), the water meter charge or the Regional Water System investment charge if the size of his services remain the same. If he upsizes either service, he will be responsible for paying the difference between those fees he previously paid and those in existence when he applies for the new services. In any case he will be responsible for all other charges including, but not limited to, hiring a contractor to perform the work required for the water/sewer abandonment and the new services installation, the City fees for inspection of the abandonment and installation, the material for the new taps, and the City fees for performing the new taps.

# 2.9 Easements for all Utilities, Bikeways and Pedestrian Pathways:

Easements for all utilities and future bikeway/pedestrian pathways and access, in recordable forms acceptable to the City, must be provided prior to application for a permit to construct being made to the City.

# 2.10 Street and Traffic Signs and Controls:

Owner shall pay for the cost and installation of all necessary on and off-site street and traffic control signage, signs signifying the street names, street striping, crosswalk striping, and traffic calming devices, as determined by the Public Services Director in his sole discretion.

### 2.11 Security Requirements:

In addition to and separate from the security required for erosion control, Owner shall comply with all Code requirements for all other security and surety requirements as set forth in the Code, including, but not limited to the financial surety and security for the project, landscaping and warranty period.

# 2.12 Record Drawings:

- a. Owner shall submit "as-built" record documents for paving, drainage, water and sewer to the City prior to the issuance of the certificate of occupancy. Reproducible hard copy drawings shall be in the form of one (1) set of 4 mil Mylar, 24" x 36" labeled as "Record Drawings" and dated. Record Drawings shall also be provided on electronic media in Adobe (pdf) format and in AutoCAD format or other format specified by Owner. Record documents shall be submitted on CDs, or other media as directed by Owner, labeled as "Record Drawings" and include the project name, City of Casper project number and date.
- b. All digital files necessary for correct plotting of the final record drawings in the AutoCAD version, such as external references, pen assignments, images, etc. shall be provided. Any x-refs or other files that can be, shall be incorporated into the final drawings to minimize the manipulation necessary for plotting.

### 2.13 Completion of Infrastructure Improvements Prior to Certificate of Occupancy:

All required on-site and off-site improvements shall be completed and approved by the Public Services Director prior to the issuance of the first certificate of occupancy unless otherwise designated in this Agreement.

### 2.14 Other Costs in Separate Agreements:

If any recapture costs, costs for a drainage basin or sub-basin wide stormwater management program are applicable to this Subdivision, those costs shall be allocated in a separate exhibit attached to this Agreement. Failure of any such exhibit to be attached to this Agreement shall not relieve the Owner of its obligation to pay its proportionate share of those costs.

# 2.15 Stormwater, Flooding and Letters of Map Revisions:

- a. Owner shall comply with and pay for all costs associated with any Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, Letter of Map Revision (LOMR), or other related requirements of Wyoming DEQ, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or any other agency that has jurisdiction over the real property in impacted by this Agreement.
- b. Owner shall provide the City with copies of all Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan elements as reviewed and approved by Wyoming DEQ; any LOMR, along with the necessary submittals to update flood mapping in accordance with FEMA requirements, and documentation of Base Flood Elevations.
- c. All requirements of this section shall be met prior to issuance of a permit to construct subdivision improvements.

# **SECTION 3 - OBLIGATIONS OF CITY**

The City shall issue a building permit and certificate of occupancy for the buildings in the Addition upon performance by the Owner of the conditions set forth herein, and upon Owner's compliance with all applicable Code requirements. All building permits will be issued by the Community Development Director in accordance with the Code.

# **SECTION 4 - REMEDIES**

In the event the Owner fails to do, or fails to cause to be done, any of the requirements set forth in this Agreement in an expeditious manner, the City may, at its option, do any or all of the following:

- a. Refuse to issue any building permits or certificates of occupancy to any person, including the Owner, or its heirs, successors, assigns and grantees.
- b. After written notice to the Owner of any public improvements which have not been completed or properly completed, and upon Owner's failure to cure the same within a reasonable period of time, the City may complete any and all of the public improvements required by this Agreement by itself or by contracting with a third party to do the same. In the event the City elects to complete said improvements, or contracts with a third party to do so, the Owner agrees to pay any and all costs resulting therefrom upon demand by the City.

The remedies provided in this section are in addition to any other remedies specifically provided for in this Agreement, or which the City may otherwise have at law or in equity, and are not a limitation upon the same. The Owner further agrees to pay all reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs, and litigation costs in

the event the City is required to enforce the provisions of this Agreement in a court of law.

# <u>SECTION 5 – GENERAL PROVISIONS</u>

- a. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>: The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, and shall inure to the benefit of all parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors, assigns, and grantees and shall bind and run with the real property that is the subject matter of this Agreement. The Owner shall not assign this Agreement or otherwise sub-contract its duties and responsibilities as set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City.
- b. Wyoming Governmental Claims Act: The City does not waive any right or rights it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, Wyoming Statute Sections 1-39-101, et seq. The City specifically reserves the right to assert any and all immunities, rights, and defenses it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act.
- c. <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>: This Agreement, its interpretation and enforcement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wyoming. Any litigation regarding this Agreement shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction situated in Natrona County, Wyoming.
- d. <u>Complete Agreement</u>: This Agreement shall constitute the entire understanding and agreement of the parties, and supersedes any prior negotiations, discussions or understandings.
- e. <u>Amendment</u>: No amendment or modification of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid or enforceable unless made in writing and executed by all parties hereto.
- f. <u>Waiver</u>: Failure on the part of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement, or the waiver thereof, in any instance, shall not be construed as a general waiver or relinquishment on its part of any such provision, but the same shall nevertheless be and remain in full force and effect.
- g. No Third-Party Beneficiary Rights: The parties to this Agreement do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third-party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The parties to this Agreement intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this Agreement shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this Agreement, to seek any remedy arising out of a party's

performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this Agreement, or to bring an action for the breach of this Agreement.

- h. <u>Severability</u>: If a court of competent jurisdiction renders any provision of this Agreement (or portion of a provision) to be invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, that provision or portion of the provision will be severed and the remainder of this Agreement will continue in full force and effect as if the invalid provision or portion of the provision were not part of this Agreement.
- i. Notices: Notices required or permitted to be given by a Party to the others must be in writing and either delivered in person or sent to the address shown below (or such subsequent address as may be designated by either party in writing) by certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid (or by a recognized courier service, such as Federal Express, UPS, or DHL), or by facsimile with correct answerback received, and will be effective upon receipt:

- j. <u>Headings</u>: The section headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation thereof.
- k. <u>Survival</u>: All representations, indemnifications, warranties and guarantees made in, required by or given in accordance with this Agreement, as well as all continuing obligations indicated in this Agreement, will survive final payment, completion and acceptance of the services and termination or completion of the Agreement.

- I. <u>Copies</u>: This Agreement may be executed in more than one copy, each copy of which shall serve as an original for all purposes, but all copies shall constitute but one and the same Agreement.
- m. <u>Authority</u>: Each individual executing this Agreement for and on behalf of their principals hereby state that they have the requisite power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated and intended hereby. Owner further states that it is authorized to transact business in the State of Wyoming, properly registered and not delinquent with the Secretary of State.
- n. <u>Term</u>: At the time the Owner files for a permit to construct, the then applicable code provisions shall apply for the life of the permit or under an extension that is approved by the Public Services Director. If the Owner fails to file for a permit to construct at the time of platting, all applicable provisions of the Code that have changed since the execution of this Agreement shall be required of the Owner at the time of permit application, and the City at its sole discretion may require a new Subdivision Agreement and/or the replatting of property. Provided, however, Code amendments pertaining to the health and safety of the public shall be complied with by the Owner during the term of this Agreement, regardless of the validity of the permit to construct.

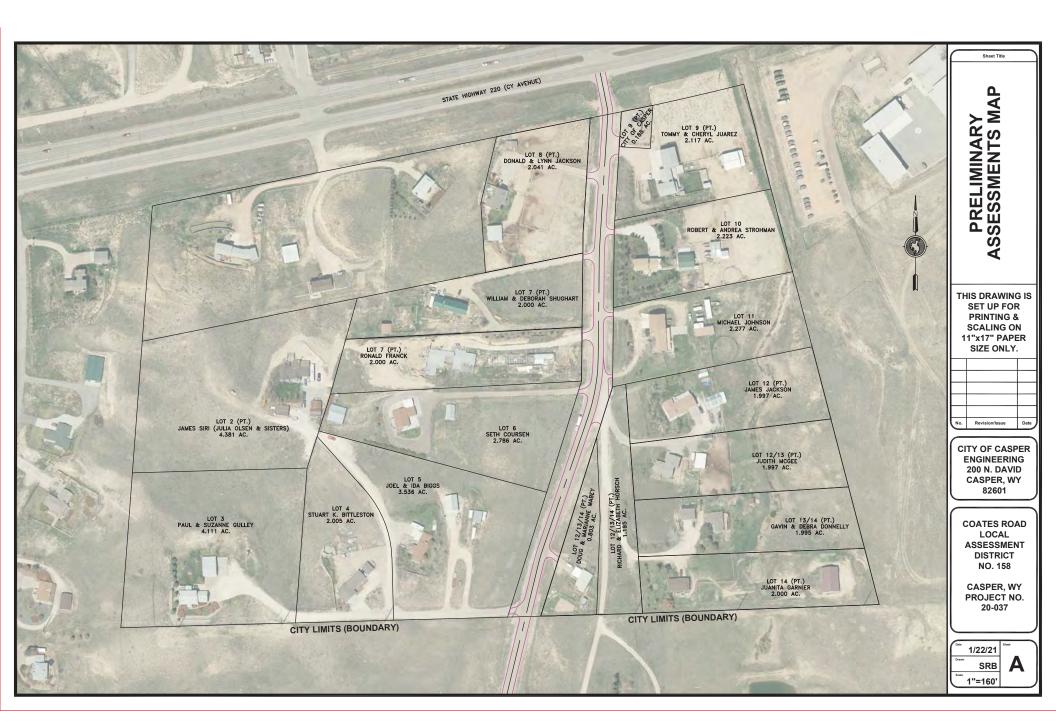

#### **ORDINANCE NO.8–21**

AN ORDINANCE CREATING CITY OF CASPER, WYOMING, LOCAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 158 (HEREINAFTER "DISTRICT"); **ORDERING CALLED** THE THE THEREIN: CONSTRUCTION **IMPROVEMENTS** OF DESCRIBING THE SAME, DIRECTING THE PREPARATION OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS THEREFOR; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS; FIXING THE BOUNDARIES OF SAID DISTRICT; RATIFYING AND. **PREVIOUSLY** TAKEN; **PRESCRIBING** DETAILS IN CONNECTION WITH SAID DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Title 15, Chapter 6, Wyoming Statutes, 1977, as amended, on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2021, the City Council (hereinafter called the "Council") of the City of Casper, Wyoming, (hereinafter called the "City") adopted a resolution declaring the intention of said Council to establish the City of Casper, Wyoming, Local Assessment District No. 158, to authorize the construction of certain local improvements therein, and to assess the cost or portion thereof of the local improvements on the property benefited thereby; and,

WHEREAS, said resolution was duly mailed and published as a notice, affidavits of such mailing and publication being now on file in the Office of the City Clerk; and,

WHEREAS, in response to said notice, no written remonstrances were filed against the proposed improvements; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing shall be held on the first reading of this ordinance, February 16, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CASPER, WYOMING:

#### Section 1. Creation of District.

That there be, and there hereby is created and established within the corporate limits of the City of Casper, Wyoming, a local improvement district for the purpose of making certain local improvements consisting of asphaltic concrete pavement on the roads hereinafter designated, and, to assess the cost thereof (except as hereinafter provided) on the property benefited thereby and included within the Local Assessment District herein described.

#### Section 2. Name of District.

The Council has determined and does hereby determine that:

A. The Local Assessment District herein described, as such might hereinafter be modified, shall be known as the "City of Casper, Wyoming, Local Assessment District No. 158";

## Section 3. Location of Paving Improvements.

The City proposes to establish grades for the following named streets, intersections, and parts of streets, within the City between the termini specified, as such are set forth on the official plats of the subdivisions or additions in said City, now on file and of record, as follows:

## LOCATION OF ROADWAY PAVING IMPROVEMENTS

	STREET	<u>WIDTH</u>	PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT
1.	Coates Road	26.0'	Asphaltic Concrete Pavement

The width in feet of said road, hereinabove set forth, is measured from the edge of the blacktop to the edge of the blacktop on each side.

## Section 4. Description of Paving Improvements.

The character, kind, and extent of the asphaltic concrete pavement improvements shall be as follows:

A. All streets as denoted in Section 3 shall include installation of a sub-base aggregate base course, a plant mix bituminous base, tack coat, and a plant mix pavement surface course, in accordance with approved City Standards. The work shall include all necessary removal, excavation, filling, grading, and replacement to design elevations and appurtenant work.

## Section 5. Boundaries of the District.

It is proposed to create the District, the boundaries of which lie entirely within the City of Casper, as follows:

Skyline Ranches Lots 2-7, Lot 8 (East Half), Lots 9-14

## Section 6. Determination of Benefits.

The City Council has determined, and does hereby determine, that the method of assessment will result in a distribution of costs among property owners in proportion to the special benefits conferred by the improvements, and that any other method of assessment would result in an inequitable distribution of costs among some owners whose property is benefitted by the improvements.

## Section 7. Method of Assessment.

- A. Paving Improvements. Each piece of property with access to the road in or along which the improvements are to be made shall be assessed by the following method:
  - 1. Each property shall be assessed on the basis of its acreage so that the total assessment

on each piece of property shall be in proportion to the total accessible acreage of the property to be assessed for the same improvement.

B. Assessment Liens. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the assessment shall be levied and an assessment lien attached on all, or a piece, of benefitted property so as to avoid the imposition of a lien upon a part of the subdivided lot or partial lot under common ownership and use.

## Section 8. Estimated Costs.

The City of Casper has agreed to design the improvements in-house. The construction of the improvements will be performed by a qualified contractor with the lowest competitive bid. The properties will be assessed the full cost for a contractor to install the asphalt pavement, plus the cost of engineering.

The estimated total costs for the total improvement project (including, but not limited to, all incidental improvements or work) are as follows:

- 1. The estimated contract price for installation of asphalt pavement is \$\frac{171,820}{}.
- 2. The estimated cost for engineering is \$15,620.
- 3. The estimated total cost of the total improvement project is \$\frac{187,440}{}.
- 4. The estimated assessable costs for each acre of property are as follows:
  - a. All Improvements \$1,575.83 per acre.
- 5. The estimated project cost of the Local Assessment District is \$187,440, which includes all improvements.

The City's funding source will be from 1%#16 funds for miscellaneous street improvements.

The City Council shall accept no bids or combination of bids, which shall exceed by more than ten percent (10%) the aforesaid estimate of the contract price unless approved by the property owners, subject to a special assessment.

## Section 9. Direction to Engineer to Proceed.

The City Engineer is hereby directed and authorized, immediately upon the passage of this Ordinance, to prepare and file with the City Clerk final plans, specifications, and the estimated cost of said improvements, which plans, specifications, and estimated cost shall show in detail the work to be done, the quantities of materials to be handled and the estimated cost of said improvements, which plans, specifications, and estimated cost shall be hereafter approved by the Council, by resolution.

It is hereby determined and ordered, that such improvements shall be made as soon as practical. Immediately after the approval of said plans and specifications, the City Clerk shall call for bids for the making of said improvements, by publishing notice in at least one issue of a newspaper published and of general circulation within the City of Casper, which notice shall be substantially in agreement with the provisions of Wyoming Statutes, 1977, as amended, and this Ordinance.

## Section 10. Maintenance of Improvements.

The maintenance of the proposed improvements after their acceptance by the City on said streets, intersections, and parts thereof, shall not be included in the construction contract or contracts, and there shall be no charges for such maintenance included in the assessments for the proposed improvements; provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to preclude provision in the contract or contracts relating to the guarantee of improvements thereunder.

#### Section 11. Ratification.

All action heretofore taken by the City and officers thereof, directed toward the creation of the City of Casper, Wyoming, Local Assessment District No. 158, the improvement of property therein and the levy of assessments therefor, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved, and confirmed.

## Section 12. Severability.

If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

## Section 13. Repealer.

All orders, bylaws, resolutions, and ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

## Recommendation:

That Council, by resolution, authorize a Memorandum of Agreement, Quitclaim Deed, and Drainage, Utility and Access Easement with the Wyoming Department of Transportation for Construction Activities for the South Poplar Street and West 1<sup>st</sup> Street Project, WYDOT Project N212121.

#### **Summary:**

WYDOT is preparing to reconstruct South Poplar Street between West 1<sup>st</sup> Street and Collins Drive. This project includes replacement of the bridge over the North Platte River to include pedestrian sidewalks and reconstruction of the intersection at South Poplar Street and West 1<sup>st</sup> Street for additional turn lanes.

To facilitate construction, WYDOT requires the acquisition of additional right-of-way from the City of Casper, as well as a drainage, utility, and access easement. The additional right-of-way, less than a tenth of an acre in size, is generally located at the southeast corner of 1<sup>st</sup> Street and Poplar Street and consists largely of city property along and in the North Platte River. The drainage, utility, and access easement is located on the south side of the river, adjacent the Poplar Street bridge, and allows for a storm sewer outfall.

#### **Financial Considerations**

WYDOT has agreed to compensate the city \$23,010 for the right-of-way and drainage, utility, and access easement to be made available to the City of Casper's revolving land fund.

**Parcel 4B -** A parcel of land located in Lot 6 of Asbell Addition, situate in the NW1/4NW1/4 of Section 9, T. 33 N., R. 79 W. of the 6th P.M., Natrona County. Said parcel contains 3,608 square feet (0.08 acres), more or less.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the promises, terms, conditions, and stipulations contained in this agreement, the parties agree to the following:

## **CONSIDERATION**

In consideration of the Landowner conveying the above-described property to the Department in accordance with this Agreement, together with all improvements located thereon and appurtenances pertaining thereto, the Department agrees to:

- 1. Compensate the Landowner in the amount of \$23,010.00, the appraised value of the property.
- 2. Relocate the Landowner's utilities as follows: N/A

The consideration stated herein is full compensation for all of the Landowner's interest which are or may be outstanding affecting any portion of the property being conveyed to the Department

### RESERVATION

There is excepted and reserved from the property all oil, gas, and other minerals that can be removed from the ground without jeopardy to the maintenance or safety of the public use or travel upon the surface estate and without using the surface of the property.

## **CONSTRUCTION PERMITS**

The Landowner hereby grants to the Department, its agents and contractor(s) permission to enter upon the following described areas for construction purposes as stated herein. Permits for said areas are located outside of and adjacent to the right-of-way line and will be of the following widths and lengths:

**Parcel 4A** - A parcel of land located in Lot 7 of Asbell Addition, situate in the NW1/4NW1/4 of Section 9, T. 33 N., R. 79 W. of the 6th P.M., Natrona County, Wyoming, adjacent to the existing easterly right of way of Poplar Street, 130.32 feet wide on the right, beginning opposite Engr. Sta. 123+32.71 being bound by the northeasterly boundary of Wilcox subdivision, tapering to and ending 117.09 feet wide opposite Engr. Sta. 123+95.16. ## TITLE WORK AND QUIETING TITLE

Before final payment is made by the Department, the Department may make a title examination to determine if sufficient title to the property is vested in the Landowner. The Department will pay all costs of any necessary abstracting. The Landowner grants to the

Department and its contractors the right of immediate entry on the property for survey and preliminary plan preparation. In the event of unacceptable title, the Landowner will cooperate with the Department to clear the title. The Department will pay all costs for quiet title actions, court orders, and any similar expenses incidental to conveying the property to the Department.

### **SOVEREIGN AND GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY**

Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-104(a), the State of Wyoming and the Wyoming Department of Transportation and the Transportation Commission of Wyoming expressly reserve sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement and specifically retain all immunities and defenses available to them as sovereigns. The parties acknowledge that the State of Wyoming has sovereign immunity and only the Wyoming Legislature has the power to waive sovereign immunity. Designations of venue, choice of law, enforcement actions, and similar provisions shall not be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity.

The Landowner does not waive any right or rights it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, Wyoming Statutes Section 1-39-101 et seq., and the Landowner specifically reserves the right to assert any and all rights, immunities, and defenses it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act.

The parties agree that any ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be strictly construed, either against or for either party, except that any ambiguity as to sovereign immunity shall be construed in favor of sovereign immunity.

### **ENTIRE AGREEMENT**

This Memorandum of Agreement is the entire Agreement and there are no additional promises, terms, conditions, stipulations or obligations between the parties. All parties having read the entire Agreement and having full knowledge of the Agreement, its intent, content, and of all clauses contained herein, place their signatures below, acknowledging and giving full and complete approval of this Agreement.

By signing below, the parties represents and warrants that they are duly authorized and have legal capacity to execute and deliver this Agreement. This Memorandum of Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their representatives, heirs, successors or assigns.

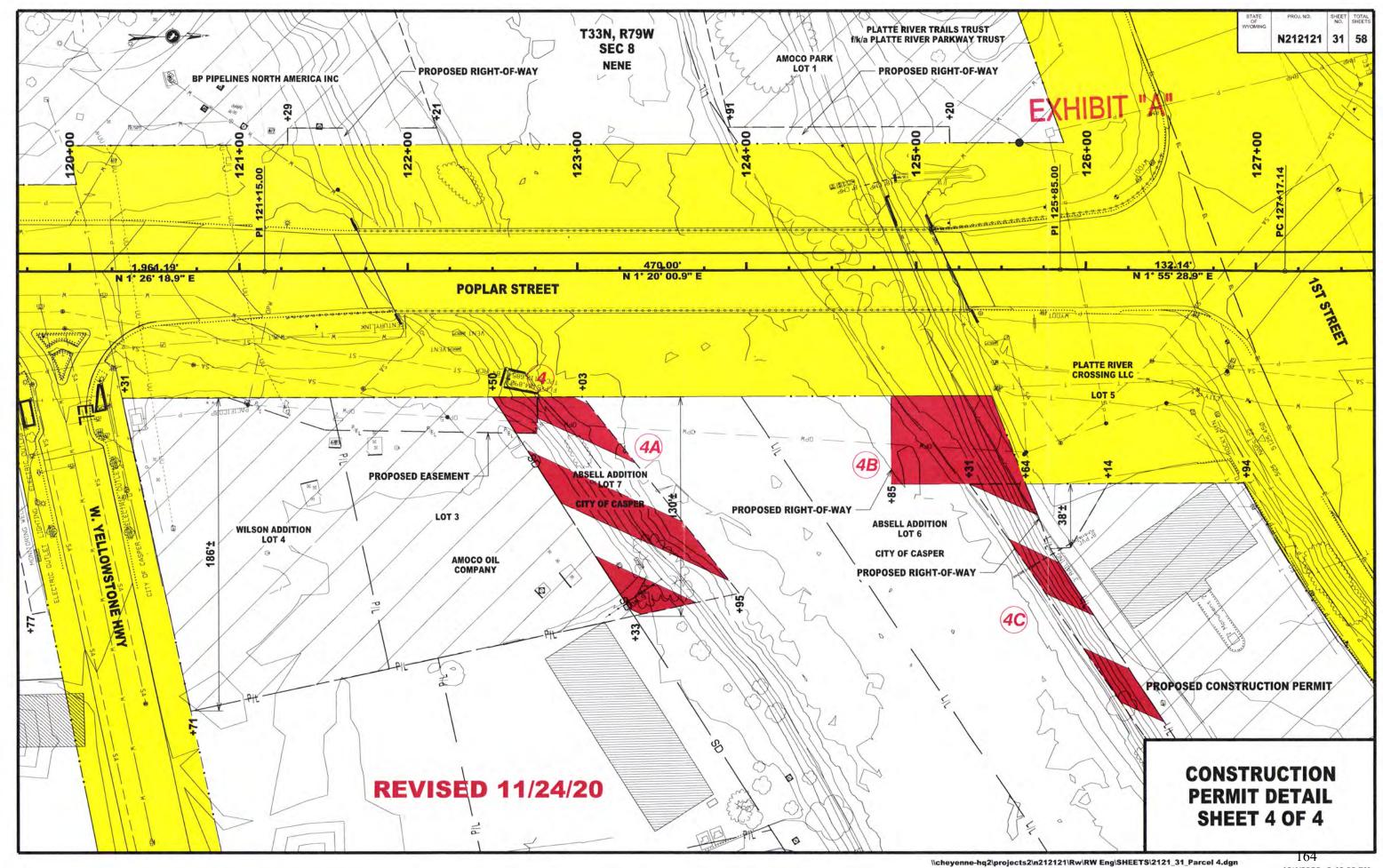

#### **Recommendation:**

That Council, by resolution, authorize an agreement with Installation and Service Company, Inc., in the amount of \$294,300, for the 2021 CPU Asphalt Repair, Project No. 21-001. Furthermore, it is recommended that Council authorize a construction contingency account, in the amount of \$20,000, for a total project amount of \$314,300.

#### **Summary:**

On Wednesday, March 3, 2021, three (3) bids were received for the 2021 CPU Asphalt Repair, Project No. 21-001. The bids received for this work are as follows:

CONTRACTOR	<b>BUSINESS LOCATION</b>	BASE BID
Installation & Service Co.	Mills, Wyoming	\$294,300.00
Crown Construction	Mills, Wyoming	\$294,412.50
Wayne Coleman Construction	Mills, Wyoming	\$300,307.00

The engineer's estimate prepared by the City Engineering Office was \$341,000, with the low bid received at \$294,300. Adding a construction contingency amount of \$20,000 will bring the total contract amount to \$314,300.

The 2021 CPU Asphalt Repair contract includes bid quantities for furnishing and installing asphalt and base course materials and other related work based on scheduled in-house waterline replacement work, as well as an estimated number of water main breaks that may occur. This type of work is anticipated every year as part of ongoing waterline maintenance. The contract includes provisions for the imposition of liquidated damages if the contractor fails to address individual street repair sites in a

## timely manner.

As required by State Statute, in-state bidders receive a five percent (5%) bid preference. As all bids were received from in-state Contractors, no bid preference was granted. A notice was published in the local newspaper once a week for two consecutive weeks as required by State Statute and the project was advertised on the City of Casper's website (www.casperwy.gov).

### **Financial Considerations:**

Funding for this project will be from the Water Fund Reserves allocated to the FY21 CPU Asphalt Repair Project.

## STANDARD FORM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND CONTRACTOR (Approved by City Attorney, 2004)

THIS AGREEMENT is made between the City of Casper, Wyoming, 200 North David Street, Casper, Wyoming 82601, hereinafter referred to as the "Owner," and Installation and Service Company, Inc., PO Box 2938, Mills, Wyoming 82644, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor."

WHEREAS, the City of Casper wants to repair asphalt damaged from the Casper Public Utilities Water Break Repair Program and the Water Line Replacement Program; and,

WHEREAS, Installation and Service Company, Inc., is able and willing to provide those services specified as the 2021 CPU Asphalt Repair Project No. 21-001.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

### ARTICLE 1. WORK.

- 1.1 Contractor shall perform all the work required by the Contract Documents for the 2021 CPU Asphalt Repair Project, No. 21-001.
- 1.2 Contractor shall perform all the work required by the Contract Documents for supplying, patching, and finishing of asphalt concrete for street repairs, and rotomilling and repairing of asphalt at various locations throughout the City of Casper and environs, for the Casper Public Utilities Water Break Repair Program and the Water Line Replacement Program, for the period of April 15, 2021, through April 14, 2022.

#### ARTICLE 2. ENGINEER.

The Project has been designed by the City of Casper, who is hereinafter referred to as the "Engineer" and who is to act as Owner's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

#### ARTICLE 3. CONTRACT TIME.

3.1 Within ten (10) days after the execution of this Agreement, the Owner will provide Contractor a written listing of "winter time" street repair locations, indicating locations requiring repair from the previous winter period as part of this Agreement. The Contractor shall finally complete these "winter time" street asphaltic repairs locations no later than June 15, 2021. The Owner assumes all responsibility for maintenance and traffic control of the "winter time" repair locations until Contractor mobilization to each location, prior to June 16, 2021. Starting June 16, 2021, the Contractor shall assume all responsibilities for any unfinished "winter time" asphaltic repairs, including all maintenance and traffic control. If

- the Contractor fails to finally complete any "winter time" street asphaltic repair location by June 15, 2021, liquidated damages as per Article 3.7 shall be invoked.
- 3.2 All asphaltic repairs locations of less than 2,000 square feet associated with the repair program, located throughout the City of Casper and environs, shall be started within seventy-two (72) hours, or three (3) working days, after email notification to Contractor by Owner that the site is ready for repair. If work does not commence within the seventy-two (72) hour or three (3) working day time period, the Contractor shall assume all responsibilities for that work site, including all maintenance and traffic control. If the Contractor fails to accept all responsibility for cuts less than 2,000 square feet within seventy-two (72) hours, or three (3) working days, liquidated damages as per Article 3.7 shall be invoked. Furthermore, if the Contractor fails to complete a site within ten (10) working days of the original email notification, liquidated damages as per Article 3.7 shall be invoked.
- 3.3 All asphaltic repairs greater than 2,000 square feet associated with the replacement program, located throughout the City of Casper and environs, shall be started within one hundred and twenty (120) hours or five (5) working days after email notification to Contractor by Owner, that the site is ready for repair. If work does not commence within this time period the Contractor shall assume all responsibilities for that work site, including all maintenance and traffic control. If the Contractor fails to accept responsibility for cuts within one hundred and twenty (120) hours or five (5) working days of email notification, liquidated damages as per Article 3.7 shall be invoked. Furthermore, if the Contractor fails to complete a site within fifteen (15) days of the original email notification, liquidated damages as per Article 3.7 shall be invoked.
- 3.4 Any and all asphaltic street repair locations provided to Contractor by Owner between the date of this Agreement and June 15, 2021, shall be completed in accordance with Articles 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3, above.
- 3.5 Once the work commences, there shall be no delays. The work shall progress in a timely continuous manner until completion. If the Contractor should discontinue work prior to completion without Owner's approval, it shall result in liquidated damages for delay as agreed in Article 3.7 of the "Agreement Between Owner and Contractor".
- 3.6 If the Contractor, or the City of Casper representative, feels that in order to adequately insure proper repairs to any given asphalt repair, that complete street closure is necessary, it shall be the Contractor's responsibility to notify all affected residences. If the closure affects business, the affected business shall be given a minimum of a 24-hour notice prior to closure.
- 3.7 Liquidated Damages. Owner and Contractor recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that Owner will suffer financial loss if the Work is not finally completed by the times and schedules specified in Paragraphs 3.1 through 3.5, inclusive, above, plus any extension thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. They also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not finally completed

on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Owner and Contractor agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty) Contractor shall pay Owner Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) for each day that expires after the times specified in Paragraphs 3.1 and 3.2, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for each day that expires after the times specified in Paragraphs 3.3 through 3.5, inclusive, for final completion. It is further agreed that such liquidated damages are not a penalty, but represent the parties' best estimate of actual damages.

### ARTICLE 4. CONTRACT PRICE.

Owner shall pay Contractor in current funds for performance of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents, subject to additions and deductions by Change Order, the contract price of Two Hundred Ninety-Four Thousand Three Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$294,300.00), subject to additions and deductions by Change Order approved by the Owner. The contract fee shall be based on materials actually furnished and installed and services actually provided based on the unit prices contained in the Bid Form and Itemized Bid Schedule, included as Exhibit "A" (pages BF-1 through BF-4, Bid Form and BS-1 through BS-2, Bid Schedule) and by this reference made a part of this Agreement.

#### ARTICLE 5. SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION

All references in the General Conditions regarding Substantial Completion shall be disregarded, and are not a part of the Contract. All progress payments to the Contractor shall be based upon acceptance of the work as finally complete at each individual work site for street repairs.

#### ARTICLE 6. PAYMENT PROCEDURES.

Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Article 14 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed through the Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.

- 6.1 Progress Payments. Owner shall make progress payments on the basis of Contractor's Applications for Payment as recommended by Engineer, on or about the 25th day of each month during construction as provided below. All progress payments will be on the basis of the progress of the Work measured by the Schedule of Values provided for in Paragraph 14.1 of the General Conditions, subject to the cutoff and submittal dates provided in the General Provisions.
  - 6.1.1 Progress payment will be made in an amount equal to ninety-five percent (95%) of the Work completed. Owner shall withhold five percent (5%) of the work completed as retainage, said retainage to be paid in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 5.3, Final Payment.
  - 6.1.2 Should amounts owed by the Contractor to the City for any goods, services, licenses, permits or any other item or purpose remain unpaid beyond the City's general credit

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policy, those amounts may be deducted from the payment being made by the City to the Contractor pursuant to this agreement.

6.2 Final Payment. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with Paragraph 14.13 of the General Conditions, Engineer shall recommend payment and present Contractor's Final Application for Payment to the City. Pursuant to Wyoming State Statutes, final payment cannot be made until forty-one (41) days after publication of the first Notice of Completion.

### ARTICLE 7. WITHHELD FUNDS.

Pursuant to Wyoming Statutes Section 16-6-701 et seq., withheld percentages for Contracts exceeding Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) will be retained in an account in the name of the Contractor (except when specifically waived in writing by Contractor) which has been assigned to the Owner until the Contract is completely, satisfactorily, and finally accepted by the Owner. Unless a depository is designated by the Contractor in a written attachment hereto, the Contractor's signature hereon shall act as authority for the Owner to designate a retainage depository on behalf of the Contractor, for the purposes specified in Wyoming Statutes Section 16-6-704. The Contractor's signature hereon shall act as an assignment of the depository account to the Owner, as provided by Wyoming Statutes Section 16-6-701 et seq., whether the depository is designated by the Contractor or by the Owner.

#### ARTICLE 8. CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS.

In order to induce Owner to enter into this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations:

- 8.1 Contractor has familiarized himself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, locality, and with all local conditions and federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, or performance of the Work.
- 8.2 Contractor has studied carefully all reports of investigations and test of subsurface and latent physical conditions at the site or otherwise affecting cost, progress, or performance of the work which were relied upon by Engineer in the preparation of the Drawings and Specifications and which have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions.
- 8.3 Contractor has made or caused to be made examinations, investigations, and test and studies as he deems necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents; and no additional examinations, investigations, tests, reports, or similar data are or will be required by Contractor for such purposes.
- 8.4 Contractor has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, tests, reports, and data with the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

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- 8.5 Contractor has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies that he has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- 8.6 Contractor certifies that materials containing asbestos will not be used for this project without prior written approval by the Owner.

### Summary

This contract provides Outside-City water service for 3222 Six Mile Road, a parcel of land located west of Casper off Six Mile Road, about ¾ of a mile north of Highway 20/26. The property will obtain water service by connecting to the 12-inch Airport waterline that crosses the property. A curb stop and meter pit will be located near the water main with City ownership and responsibility ending at the curb stop. The Owners will furnish, install, own, and maintain the meter pit and water service line from the curb stop to the residence.

This property is not contiguous to the Casper City limits and a Commitment to Annex has been signed as it is within Casper's growth boundary. The Owner has provided an O&E report as there is no mortgage on the property. The Public Utilities Advisory Board conceptually approved the contract at its February 24, 2021 meeting and has recommended Council approval.

### CONTRACT FOR OUTSIDE-CITY WATER SERVICE

THIS AGREEMENT is made, dated, and signed this day of,	2021,
by and between the City of Casper, Wyoming, a municipal corporation, 200 North David	Street,
Casper, Wyoming 82601, hereinafter referred to as "City", and L.L. Enterprises, P.O. Box	1655,
Mills, Wyoming 82644; hereinafter referred to as "Owner."	

### **RECITALS**

- A. Owner is the owner of certain land as described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part of this agreement, being Lot 1 of the B&L Industrial Acres Subdivision, a portion of the NE1/4 NE1/4 of Section 28, Township 34 North, Range 80 West of the 6th P.M., in Natrona County, Wyoming, with an address of 3222 Six Mile Road, which is not within the corporate limits of the City of Casper; and,
- B. The Owner is currently receiving water service through a private water system line also serving other customers in the area; and
- C. Owner desires to obtain water service from City for such property as described in Exhibit "A"; and,
- D. Owner can connect by a service line into the 12-inch water main located adjacent to the property; and,
- E. Owner and City have agreed to such outside-city water service under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed among the parties as follows:

### 1. Service

- a. The property served shall be limited to that described in Exhibit "A." No other properties shall be served without the express permission of the City Council of the City of Casper.
- b. Owner shall be allotted one (1), water service connection and meter to the property shown on Exhibit "A." No other properties may be served from this connection.
- c. The water service line curb box shall be installed approximately ten (10) feet from the transmission line. A meter pit and water meter shall be installed by Owner immediately downstream of the curb box.
- d. The City shall own, operate, and maintain the individual 1-inch service line to the curb stop. The Owner shall install, own, operate, and maintain the meter pit and the water service line beyond the curb stop.

e. The Owner shall be responsible for obtaining easements from other property owners for the water service line as needed at its sole cost and expense.

### 2. Right of Inspection

- a. The City shall have the right to inspect all water system construction. All water system construction must meet City requirements. Before connection of the water services to any building, all work must be accepted and approved by the City.
- b. The curb box for the water service line shall be protected during the subsequent course of developing the property from damage, and the Owner shall be wholly responsible for the repair and replacement to the City's satisfaction of such that are damaged or destroyed. If the Owner shall fail or refuse to promptly repair or replace such boxes as required, the City may do so and charge the Owner directly for said cost. The Owner shall adjust said valve and curb boxes to finished grade.

### 3. <u>Charges for Service</u>

- a. All meter pits, vaults, and water meters, as required by the City's staff, shall be obtained and installed by and at the Owner's sole cost and expense according to the rules and regulations of the City. The meter pit or vault shall remain the property of the Owner and be located on the property lines or within the water line easement.
- b. Owner will pay to the City the then-current outside-City system investment charge for each connection (lot) to be served with water. The Owner shall also pay to the Central Wyoming Regional Water System Joint Powers Board, the then-current Regional Water System investment charge for each connection to be served with water. Payment will be made prior to actual receipt of water service provided by the City.
- c. The charge for water service provided shall be at the City's existing rate as the same shall apply from time to time for all retail outside-City water service, until such time as said property is annexed into the City of Casper. After annexation, the rates will be the existing rates for retail inside-City water service.

### 4. Regulation

- a. Water service to be provided shall be only to the extent provided for herein and to the extent that said water service is available and above that which is necessary to satisfy the needs of the incorporated area of the City of Casper. In times of drought, extreme demand, or facility failure, water service may not be available.
- b. Owner shall make the necessary provisions so that each building to be served shall have a pressure reducing valve limiting pressure to a maximum of 60 psi, and shall encourage all residents to adhere to the following water saving device

recommendations: toilets with a maximum flush of 3 1/3 gallons; aerators which provide for a maximum flow of 1 gpm on all bathroom sinks; and water saving shower heads to limit flow to maximum 3.0 gpm.

c. The Owner agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of the City regarding the use of its water and sewer facilities, all relevant ordinances of the City of Casper relating to water and sewer service; all other state and federal laws, rules, and regulations including, but not limited to, all provisions of the Federal Pretreatment Regulations (40CFR, Part 403), and all City ordinances relating to industrial pretreatment.

### 5. Fire Flows

- a. The Owner agrees that fire flow capabilities to his properties are impractical at this time. The Owner, by signing this agreement, understands that there are certain risks that Owner and Owner's property may be subject to by not having fire flow capabilities. The Owner is willing to assume these risks and irrevocably, fully and forever releases and discharges the City of Casper, the City Council, and its mayor, the Casper Public Utilities Board, and all their officers, employees, agents, managers, and contractors from all negligence, claims, demands, liabilities, causes of action, or damages of any kind relating to any harm, personal injury, wrongful death, property damage, or debt suffered resulting from lack of fire flow to Owner's property.
- b. The terms of this release in this Agreement are contractual and not a mere recital. If the property is owned or leased by the Owner, and anyone else as husband and wife, tenants in common, partnership, corporation, or any other legal entity other than an individual, Owner hereby states and certifies that the Owner is authorized by such individual or other entity to bind such individual or entity to this release. This release shall be binding upon the Owner's personal representatives, heirs, successors, and/or assigns. The Owner acknowledges by execution of this release that Owner fully understands these provisions and fully and voluntarily enters into them. This release shall not affect any immunities of the City of Casper pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, Wyoming Statutes Section 1-39-101 et seq., as amended.

### 6. <u>Construction Term</u>

The Owner shall be allowed two (2) years from the time of consummation of this Agreement to complete the water service line construction and necessary improvements. Should the construction not be completed within this time period, this Agreement shall automatically become null and void.

### 7. Annexation

The Owner hereby agrees to annex its property to the City upon the request of the City Council, or upon a property owner's petition for the annexation thereof. The Owner and its mortgagee(s) shall execute a commitment to annex its property to the City of Casper on a form acceptable to the City of Casper. The commitment to annex form shall be executed concurrently with this agreement. It shall provide that the commitment to annex shall be binding upon the Owner and its mortgagee(s), their heirs, successors, and assigns forever, and shall be included in every sale, conveyance or mortgage involving the above-described property. It shall further run with and bind the real property described and set forth in Exhibit "A." This Agreement shall terminate, and be null and void between the parties, and the City shall have the right to terminate all services provided under this Agreement if the Owner fails to annex its property to the City within one (1) year after being requested to do so by the City Council, or within one (1) year after the City Council's approval of a property owner's petition for the annexation thereof.

### 8. <u>Future Improvements</u>

- a. The Owner agrees to participate in future water system, sewer system, street improvements, sidewalk improvements, street lighting improvements, and other needed municipal improvements on Grey Cloud and Six Mile Roads at the request of the City Council of Casper. The participation may be with the City of Casper, an Improvement and Service District, a Water and Sewer District, or a private developer.
- b. Future design and construction costs include, but are not limited to, planning, design, construction, land acquisition, financing, and legal.
- c. The Owner agrees to and hereby waives any statutory right to protest the commitment to participate in future water system, sewer system, street, sidewalk, street lighting, or other needed municipal system improvements. The Owner further agrees to and hereby waives any statutory right to protest the creation of a Local Assessment District, an Improvement and Service District, or a Water and Sewer District established for the purpose of street, sidewalk, street lighting, or other needed municipal improvements which would encompass his property.
- d. This commitment to participate in future water system, sewer system, street, sidewalk, street lighting, or other municipal improvement design and construction shall be included in every sale, conveyance, or mortgage involving the above described property and shall be binding upon the current owners and mortgagees, and all heirs, successors in interest and assigns. This commitment shall be binding upon and run with the land set forth herein.

### 9. <u>Discontinuance of Utility Services/Remedies</u>

- a. A utility service provided under this Agreement may be discontinued in accordance with Casper Municipal Code Section 13.03.070, or for any material breach of this Agreement by the Owner.
- b. The remedies in this section are in addition to any other remedies in this Agreement, or which the City may otherwise have at law or equity, and are not a limitation on the same. The Owner further agrees to pay all reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs, and litigation costs if the City must enforce the provisions of this Agreement in a court of law.

### 10. General Provisions

- a. <u>Successors, Assigns and Recording</u>: The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, and shall inure to the benefit of all parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors, assigns, and grantees and shall bind and run with the real property and set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and shall be recorded in the Natrona County real estate records by the City at the Owner's sole cost and expense. The Owner shall not assign this Agreement or otherwise sub-contract its duties and responsibilities as set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City.
- b. Wyoming Governmental Claims Act: The City does not waive any right or rights it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, Wyoming Statute Sections 1-39-101, et seq. The City specifically reserves the right to assert any and all immunities, rights, and defenses it may have pursuant to the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act.
- c. <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>: This Agreement, its interpretation and enforcement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wyoming. Any litigation regarding this Agreement shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction situated in Natrona County, Wyoming.
- d. <u>Complete Agreement</u>: This Agreement shall constitute the entire understanding and agreement of the parties, and supersedes any prior negotiations, discussions or understandings.

- 1. <u>Copies</u>: This Agreement may be executed in more than one copy, each copy of which shall serve as an original for all purposes, but all copies shall constitute but one and the same Agreement.
