Solid Waste Study

The City of Casper Regional Solid Waste Facility is in the midst of completing a residential waste study. The study will provide an analysis of the quantity and composition of the city's residential waste stream as well as residential waste disposal habits. A similar study was completed in 1993. Garbage was collected from 181 residential dumpsters and taken to a special area where the garbage was sorted by category and weighed. The

weight of garbage collected totaled 14,258 pounds or 7.1 tons. Some early findings: 35.9% of Casper's residential waste stream is organic with 19.9% food scraps and 16% yard waste. The next highest percent, by weight, of residential




garbage is plastics at 13.5%. When compared to the 1993 study food

scraps percentage (10%), food scraps have nearly doubled. Some categories of waste are lower than in 1993. Metals are now 3.3% of the waste stream compared to 6.5% in 1993 and paper is 10.1% compared to 28.5%. When the study is complete, the information will be used to determine ways the city might be able to reduce the amount of waste going into the landfill, and to help Casper become a more sustainable community.


Broadway in Casper!


