“Writing Wyoming” Book Discussion Program

Casper, Wyoming – Fort Caspar Museum will host “Writing Wyoming,” a reading and discussion series in the Wyoming Humanities Council’s Reading Wyoming program. The discussion group meets at the museum on August 25, September 15, October 13, and November 17 at 7:00 p.m. and is free and open to people of all ages. Participants will read and discuss “Rising from the Plains” by John McPhee, “Windmill: Essays from Four Mile Ranch” by David Romtvedt, “What You See in Clear Water” by Geoff O’Gara, and “Close Range” by Annie Proulx. All of these books depict what it means to live in Wyoming and explore the myth and the reality of the people and the place. Patrick Amelotte, an English instructor at Casper College, will lead the discussions.

The program is offered by the Wyoming Humanities Council. Reading Wyoming provides reading and discussion series to nonprofit organizations around the state and is funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities.
