## COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS Casper City Hall – Council Chambers August 29, 2017

Casper City Council met in special session at 4:30 p.m., Tuesday, August 29, 2017. Present: Councilmembers Hopkins, Johnson, Laird, Morgan, Pacheco, Powell, and Mayor Humphrey. Councilmembers Huckabay and Walsh were absent.

At 4:30 p.m. the Council departed to the former Plains Furniture building (322 S. David Street). City staff had been notified a week earlier that the former Nolan Chevrolet body shop, estimated to have been built in 1925, was completely preserved within the walls and roof of the Plains building. Staff confirmed that it was indeed there, as well as facades from the other original buildings in that block of David Street, and set up the tour for Council. Staff taped up photos on the walls of the Plains building displaying the original Nolan building, so Council members could see what was encapsulated there. Several ceiling and wall panels had been removed revealing the historical structure. In addition, staff had prepared renderings of how the historical structure could be repurposed and incorporated into the block, in accordance with the Old Yellowstone District (OYD) Master Plan. Approximately 48 citizens attended the tour, as the paper had reported it was open to the public. Many attendees were members of the OYD Advisory committee, Casper Historic Preservation Commission, members of the media, and former employees of Nolan Chevrolet in the 1950's.

Council reconvened at 5:22 p.m. in the Council Meeting Room to hold and executive session. The work session was adjourned at 6:31 p.m.
